II. Passage Outline

- A. Priests (Leviticus 21:1-9)
 - Separate from death except for a blood/close flesh relative
 - Because they offer the Lord's "food/bread"

Leviticus 21:6

They shall be holy to their God and not profane the name of their God. For they offer the Lord's food offerings, the bread of their God; therefore they shall be holy.

Numbers 19:13

Whoever touches a dead person, the body of anyone who has died, and does not cleanse himself, *defiles* the tabernacle of the Lord...

Ezekiel 44:25-28

²⁵ They shall not defile themselves by going near to a dead person. However, for father or mother, for son

or daughter, for brother or unmarried sister they may defile themselves. ²⁶ After he has become clean, they shall count seven days for him. ²⁷ And on the day that he goes into the Holy Place, into the inner court, to minister in the Holy Place, <u>he shall offer his sin/[purification] offering</u>, declares the Lord God. ²⁸ "This shall be their inheritance: *I am their inheritance*: and you shall give them no possession in Israel; *I am their possession*.

- 3. May not marry a defiled/divorced woman
- 4. An adulterous daughter

Leviticus 21:8–9

⁸ You shall sanctify [the priest], for he offers the bread of your God. He shall be holy to you, for I, the Lord, who sanctify you, am holy. ⁹ And the daughter of any priest, *if she profanes herself by whoring, profanes her father*; she shall be burned with fire.

- B. High Priest (Leviticus 21:10–15)
 - 1. May not even grieve for parents
 - 2. Because of the anointing oil...

Leviticus 21:10–12

whose head the anointing oil is poured and who has been consecrated to wear the garments, shall not let the hair of his head hang loose nor tear his clothes. He shall not go in to any dead bodies nor make himself unclean, even for his father or for his mother. He shall not go out of the sanctuary, lest he profane the sanctuary of his God, for the consecration of the anointing oil of his God is on him: I am the Lord.

- 3. May only marry a pure blood virgin
- 4. Because... undefiled seed

1 Corinthians 6:13-20

¹³ "Food is meant for the stomach and the stomach for food"—and God will destroy both one and the other. The body is not meant for sexual immorality, but for the Lord, and the Lord for the body. 14 And God raised the Lord and will also raise us up by his power. ¹⁵ Do you not know that *your bodies are members of* Christ? Shall I then take the members of Christ and make them *members of a prostitute*? Never! ¹⁶ Or do you not know that he who is joined to a prostitute becomes one body with her? For, as it is written, "The two will become *one flesh*." ¹⁷ But he who is joined to the Lord becomes *one spirit* with him. ¹⁸ Flee from sexual immorality. Every other sin a person commits is outside the body, but the sexually immoral person sins against his own body. ¹⁹ Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God? You are not your own, 20 for you were bought with a price. So glorify God in your body.

 - Shadow OT High Priest had no symbolic contact with corruption or defilement.
 - 2. Reality NT Jesus... (Our Spiritual union with Jesus bring us to obedience makes us His eternal family)

Matthew 12:46-50

⁴⁶ While he was still speaking to the people, behold, his *mother and his brothers* stood outside, asking to speak to him. ⁴⁸ But he replied to the man who told

him, "Who is my mother, and who are my brothers?" ⁴⁹ And stretching out his hand toward his disciples, he said, "*Here are my mother and my brothers*! ⁵⁰ For whoever does the will of my Father in heaven is my brother and sister and mother."

Hebrews 7:23-28

...[Jesus] is able to save to the uttermost those who draw near to God through him, since he always lives to make intercession for them. The For it was indeed fitting that we should have such a high priest, holy, innocent, unstained, separated from sinners, and exalted above the heavens. The has no need, like those high priests, to offer sacrifices daily, first for his own sins and then for those of the people, since he did this once for all when he offered up himself.
