Psalm 107:1-32 {Responsive reading}

Oh, give thanks to the LORD, for He is good! For His mercy endures forever. ²Let the redeemed of the LORD say so, Whom He has redeemed from the hand of the enemy, ³And gathered out of the lands, From the east and from the west, From the north and from the south. ⁴They wandered in the wilderness in a desolate way; They found no city to dwell in. ⁵Hungry and thirsty, Their soul fainted in them. ⁶Then they cried out to the LORD in their trouble, And He delivered them out of their distresses. ⁷And He led them forth by the right way, That they might go to a city for a dwelling place. ⁸Oh, that men would give thanks to the LORD for His goodness, And for His wonderful works to the children of men! ⁹For He satisfies the longing soul, And fills the hungry soul with goodness. ¹⁰Those who sat in darkness and in the shadow of death, Bound in affliction and irons -- ¹¹Because they rebelled against the words of God, And despised the counsel of the Most High, ¹²Therefore He brought down their heart with labor; They fell down, and there was none to help. ¹³Then they cried out to the LORD in their trouble, And He saved them out of their distresses. ¹⁴He brought them out of darkness and the shadow of death, And broke their chains in pieces. ¹⁵Oh, that men would give thanks to the LORD for His goodness, And for His wonderful works to the children of men! ¹⁶For He has broken the gates of bronze, And cut the bars of iron in two. ¹⁷Fools, because of their transgression, And because of their iniquities, were afflicted. ¹⁸Their soul abhorred all manner of food, And they drew near to the gates of death. ¹⁹Then they cried out to the LORD in their trouble, And He saved them out of their distresses. ²⁰He sent His word and healed them, And delivered them from their destructions. ²¹Oh, that men would give thanks to the LORD for His goodness, And for His wonderful works to the children of men! ²²Let them sacrifice the sacrifices of thanksgiving, And declare His works with rejoicing. ²³Those who go down to the sea in ships, Who do business on great waters, ²⁴They see the works of the LORD, And His wonders in the deep. ²⁵For He commands and raises the stormy wind, Which lifts up the waves of the sea. ²⁶They mount up to the heavens, They go down again to the depths; Their soul melts because of trouble. ²⁷They reel to and fro, and stagger like a drunken man, And are at their wits' end. ²⁸Then they cry out to the LORD in their trouble, And He brings them out of their distresses. ²⁹He calms the storm, So that its waves are still. ³⁰Then they are glad because they are quiet; So He guides them to their desired haven. ³¹Oh, that men would give thanks to the LORD for His goodness, And for His wonderful works to the children of men! ³²Let them exalt Him also in the assembly of the people, And praise Him in the company of the elders.

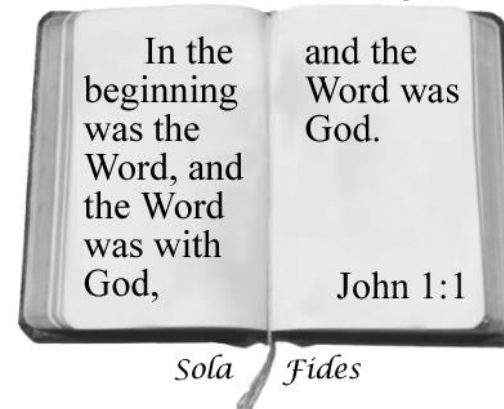
