I & II. THE MEANING & EVIDENCE OF THE SPIRIT'S INDWELLING

- A. If a true believer, you are so solely by the Spirit's indwelling (1 Cor. 12:3)
 - 1. True believers bear evidence of being spiritually resurrected (Rom 8:9-11)
 - a. Christ living in you cannot be hidden
 - b. Spirit of Christ is not a mere guest but a power dwelling within
 - He is the completing the workmanship of Jesus (Eph. 2:10)
 - He enables them to mortify deeds of body (vs. 13)
 - He leads His people (vs. 14)
 - He is groaning within His people (vs. 23)
 - He is our Divine Helper (vs. 26)
- B. The incoming and indwelling of the Holy Spirit is our *first resurrection*
 - 1. Before His quickening, all are dead in trespasses and sin (Romans 8:7-8)
 - a. this is easily to prove if you compare how we relate to the 'earthly vs. the heavenly' the 'human vs. the divine'
 - 2. What is the only remedy: the quickening Spirit of Jesus Christ (Rom. 8:11)
 - a. He who raised up Jesus Christ is the One Who needs to raise us up
 - b. Yet God quickens us in the 'use of His Word' (Col. 1:28-29)
 - be under the Word
 - turn away from all the wrong God tells you
 - let God's promise encourage you: Proverbs 1:23

III. THE COMFORT OF THE SPIRIT'S INDWELLING

- A. The Spirit not only renews our spirit but also our body (Rom. 8:11)
 - 1. While on earth, God's saints are raised to a new life (Rom. 6:4; Col. 3:1)
 - 2. Yet our 'body remains dead because of sin' (vs. 10)
 - a. The 'body' in Romans 7:24 refers to indwelling sin
 - b. The 'body' is Romans 8:11 refers to the physical body
 - 3. The promise: our bodies will be resurrected like Jesus Himself!
 - a. This truth is a cornerstone in the Christian comfort
 - b. Jesus was the first fruit (1 Cor. 15:20-22)
 - c. We will rise with our own body in a perfect condition (1 Cor. 15:42-44)

Living the truth ...

- A. Brethren: do we live in the anticipation of this glorious truth?
 - 1. How close does our life resemble Paul's in Phil. 1 & 3?
 - a. Do we long to depart to be with Christ? (Phil. 1:23)
 - b. Do we long to be rid of our vile body and be like Christ? (Phil. 3:20-21)
 - c. If so, be of good cheer: He which hath began a good work in you will perform it until the day of Jesus Christ. (Phil 1:6)
