

Seal Judgments (Part One)

The opening verses of Revelation 6 detail the appearance of _____ horses. Each horse has a _____, and the first horse and rider commence the seal judgments. The opening of each seal represent a specific _____ judgment that will be poured out on earth. It would seem that these seal judgments take place over the course of the Tribulational period. The first five taking place during the first _____ (42 months) of the Tribulation and the last two taking place in the second half.
