II. Wisdom's First Steps - The Fear of the Lord - It's Benefits - Pt 4

- A. The Good of the Fear of the Lord
 - 1. Serves as the Beginning of Wisdom
 - a. Beginning Pro 1:7
 - b. *re'shiyth* the first, in place, time, order or rank (a firstfruit), beginning, chief (-est), first(-fruits, part, time), principal thing.
 - c. How it was used
 - i. Ge 1:1 the absolute beginning
 - ii. temporally first thing
 - iii. quantitatively chief thing, the choice part
 - iv. philosophically principle thing
 - d. How should we understand "beginning"
 - i. in Pro 9:10 *tachillah* in the sense of opening; a commencement; begin(-ning), first (time).
 - ii. a parallel verse using a synonym that gives the meaning of "first in time"
 - 2. What is Biblical Wisdom?
 - a. 325 Mentions in various forms in the OT
 - b. Like a microscope, wisdom magnifies and focuses life using the optics of Scripture in order of one to believe and behave so as to glorify and please God
 - c. What Biblical Wisdom involves . . .
 - i. Knowing facts of divine revelation
 - ii. Understanding the intentions of God that leads to a life of redemption and practical sanctification
 - iii. Wisdom then engages the intellect and will to translate this knowledge and understanding into a pattern of godly experience as a habit of one's life.
 - d. OT illustrations of wisdom
 - i. The artisan skillfully making something beautiful from raw materials Ex 35:10
 - ii. Intellectual skill in observing and explaining how the natural world works Pr

6:6-8

- iii. Applying knowledge skillfully in a common sense way which allows one to live life with minimal obstacles, but could have no relationship with God.
- iv. Adds the unique dimension of "the Fear of the Lord," it is both utilitarian, but also spiritual and eternal. This wisdom can only be taught by God's Spirit to believers who seek it. Ps 49:3; 51:6; Pr 1:1-7; 15:31-32; 22:17-21
- B. The Fear of the Lord Brings
 - 1. Knowledge 1:7 The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge, But fools despise wisdom and instruction.
 - a. Form is Antithetical (A, but B)
 - b. The verse impresses that we must start our learning by learning where we stand before God
 - i. If gripped by the Fear of the Lord ,
 - we will be ready to learn and apply God's principles for life
 - we will accept both instruction and rebuke from God's Word
 - ii. If not gripped by the Fear of the Lord,
 - we will pick and choose according to our desires and prejudices

- 2. Wisdom 9:10
 - a. Form is Synonymous (B re-words A)
 - i. In Line A, wisdom is equated to discernment in Line B
 - ii. In Line A, the Fear of the Lord is equated to the knowledge of the Holy One
 - b. The Beginning See A,1,d.
 - c. The Fear of the Lord and the knowledge of the Holy One, being related ideas, are grounded in a relationship of submission and reverence.
- 3. Long Life 10:27
 - a. Form combines Antithetical (A, but B) + Consequence (B is what happen when you do A)
 - b. two things to remember that give understanding
 - i. Nature of Proverbs general principles not all is said that could be
 - ii. Setting of Proverbs within the Mosaic Covenant promised health and prosperity for believing obedience Ex 15:26; De 7:12-15
 - c. For the New Covenant follower,
 - i. lifestyle choices would likely remove us from liability to various forms of death like a jealous spouse, VD, criminal revenge, police etc
 - ii. Obviously eternal life is also partly in view
- 4. Strong Confidence and a Refuge 14:26
 - a. Form is Consequence (B is what happen when you do A)
 - b. Assurance of God's love, and acceptance come from obedience
 - c. Knowing God's sovereignty only brings good to conform me to Christ gives peace
 - d. A b+c life lived gives the example for the next generation
- 5. A Fountain of Life 14:27
 - a. Form is Consequence (B is what happen when you do A)
 - b. Jesus speaking of eternal life uses the same concept Jo 4:14
- 6. Peace and Satisfaction 15:16
 - a. This is an Evaluation Proverb (A is better than B)
 - b. Walking with God, using His wisdom, alleviates problems with people and powers that be
- 7. The Discipline for Wisdom 15:33
 - a. Form is synonymous (B re-words A)
 - b. The fear of the Lord (humility Pr 22:4) brings God's training
- 8. Preservation from Evil 16:6
 - a. Form is Consequence (B is what happen when you do A)
 - b. Much difficulty in interpretation, lots of questions, whose attributes? works salvation?
 - c. Best interpretation
 - i. Line A, how sins are to be expiated
 - ii. Line B, how sin is to be avoided
- 9. Life, Peace of Mind, and Preservation 19:23
 - a. Form is Consequence (B is what happen when you do A)
 - b. similar to # 3, 4, 8
 - c. on the eternal plane, it is literally true
- 10. Riches, Honor, and Life 22:4
 - a. Form is Consequence (B is what happen when you do A)
 - b. Line B is understood in the context of the Mosaic Covenant
 - c. the one that comes to Christ in humility will be rewarded in eternity
- 11. Praise 31:30
 - a. Form is Evaluation (B is better than A)
 - b. forms an *Inclusio* with 1:7, starts and ends the book w/ the Fear of the Lord
 - c. Similar to 1 Pe 3:1-6, true beauty is found in the Fear of the Lord
