Jesus Which Was Crucified

"And the angel answered and said unto the women, Fear not ye: for I know that ye seek Jesus, which was crucified."

(Matthew 28:5)

hen the women went to the sepulcher looking for the body of our LORD Jesus, they encountered an angel sent from God who declared, "Fear not ye, I know that ye seek Jesus, who was crucified." What gracious words these are to blood-bought, Spirit-taught sinners. What happened at the cross is everything to God, to the angels and to God's elect when the Spirit is pleased to reveal Him in them.

Yet, just as vital is the word in the following verse 6, "He is not here: for he is risen, as he said. Come, see the place where the LORD lay." Christ's resurrection from the grave is evidence that as the Crucified One, His sacrificial death was the just payment for the satisfaction of God's law, whereby He did once and for all put away the sin of His people. His resurrection from the grave means that they were justified, acquitted before Holy God by His obedience unto death, Romans 4:25. Notice the relationship between the words, 'Fear not ye' and 'Jesus, Who was crucified.' Because of Christ's death, God the Father has once for all, forgiven, reconciled and declared just at the cross every sinner on whom He set His love before the

foundation of the world, <u>Eph. 1:4</u>. Any blood-bought sinners who are still in Spiritual ignorance and darkness, the Spirit of God will certainly bring, in God's appointed time and place, to seek Jesus crucified. That is the only reason and way any do seek Him.

The Glorious Truth is that when Christ died and rose again, His people died and rose in Him as their Representative. Our LORD's resurrection from the dead is evidence of His work of salvation fully accomplished for them, <u>Acts 2:32-33</u>. Even so, in time He does Spiritually raise them through the new birth and thereby reconcile their hearts to Him, revealing in them the Truth of His great sacrifice which He accomplished on their behalf, even while they were yet in their sin, ignorance and rebellion.

"He shall feed His flock like a shepherd; He shall gather the lambs with His arm, and carry them in His bosom, and shall gently lead those that are with young." (Isaiah 40:11) This is a most beautiful expression, denoting the care of God the Savior for the feeblest and weakest of His people, the most tender lamb, unable to keep up with the flock, although weary and exhausted; the Shepherd naturally takes it in His arms and carries it. Salvation is in HIM, not the sheep.

The Righteousness that Faith Eyes

dam's righteousness was but the righteousness of a creature but the righteousness about which faith is exercised is the righteousness of God, [Romans 3:21; Romans 10:3]. Adam's righteousness was a mutable righteousness, a righteousness that might be sinned away but the righteousness about which the believer's faith is exercised is an everlasting righteousness, a righteousness that cannot be sinned away, 2 Corinthians 5:21, Proverbs 8:18; Daniel 9:24: "Seventy weeks are determined upon thy people and upon thy holy city, to finish the transgression, and to make an end of sins, and to make reconciliation for iniquity, and to bring in everlasting righteousness, and to seal up the vision and prophecy, and to anoint the most holy."

"Thy righteousness is an everlasting righteousness, and thy law is the truth." (Psalm 119:142) The righteousness of Adam was a righteousness subject to shaking and we know that Satan did shake all his righteousness about his ears, as I may say. But the glorious righteousness about which faith is conversant is an unshaken righteousness, a righteousness that cannot be shaken: "Thy righteousness is like the great mountains," or rather, as it is in the Hebrew, "Thy righteousness is like the mountains of God." (Psalm 36:6) What is more stable than a mountain! And what mountain so stable as the Mountain of God! The mountains cannot be shaken, no more can that glorious righteousness of Christ, about which a believer's faith is exercised.
