- B. Main point: Unity does not imply uniformity

II. **But ... each one has one** (Eph 4:7)

- A. From all of us to each of us
 - 1. Grace gifts are given in a different variety and measure
 - 2. Understanding the variety of gifts is a key to understanding and loving one another
 - 3. A Gift catalog
 - a. Romans 12:3-8
 - b. 1 Corinthians 12:4-29

III. How did Christ arrive in the position to be able to give gifts to men (Eph 4:8-10)

- A. Psalm 68 a triumphant procession
 - 1. A textual problem did He *receive* or *give* gifts? Does Paul misquote Psalm 68?
 - 2. The liturgical use of Psalm 68 at Pentecost
 - 3. Acts 2:33 in order to give, Jesus had to first ascend and receive.
- B. Ascending and Descending
 - 1. Where did Christ descend to? (the lower parts of the earth)
 - a. The womb (Psalm 139:15)
 - b. The grave
 - c. Hell (limbus patrium Abraham's bosom)
 - d. Hell (to suffer)
 - 2. Why I do not believe he descended into hell
 - a. Descending is the opposite of ascending
 - b. Leading captivity captive refers to enemies not OT saints
 - c. There is no indication of any batter after the cross
 - d. Paul could have used a much clearer term for hell
 - e. Compare the Scriptures (Jn 8:23, Acts 2:19, Is 44:23)
 - 3. Christ descended from heaven to earth in the incarnation, suffered and died on the cross, and rose on the third day.
 - 4. He vanquished the enemies of mankind and from His exalted position (Col 2:13-15)
 - 5. He gave gifts to men beginning at Pentecost

IV. Application

- A. Are you aware of the gifts God has given you?
- B. Are you taking the necessary measures to nurture and use those gifts?
 - 1. Remember the wicked servant of Matthew 25
- C. 1 Peter 4:10-11
