"Ready To Forgive!" 2 Corinthians 2:5-11

Introduction:

- 1. Please Turn Back With Me In Your Bibles To:
 - 2 Corinthians 2:5-11:
 - "But if any have caused grief, he hath not grieved me, but in part: that I may not overcharge you all. / Sufficient to such a man is this punishment, which was inflicted of many. / So that contrariwise ye ought rather to forgive him, and comfort him, lest perhaps such a one should be swallowed up with overmuch sorrow. / Wherefore I beseech you that ye would confirm your love toward him. / For to this end also did I write, that I might know the proof of you, whether ye be obedient in all things. / To whom ye forgive any thing, I forgive also: for if I forgave any thing, to whom I forgave it, for your sakes forgave I it in the person of Christ; / Lest Satan should get an advantage of us: for we are not ignorant of his devices!"
- 2. Before We Look More Closely:
 - Into The Rest Of These Verses:
 - I Would Like For Us To Ponder:
 - That Last Verse For A Moment:
 - "Lest Satan should get an advantage of us: for we are not ignorant of his devices!"
 - This Is A Sobering Thought, Isn't It?
 - That "Satan" Could "Get An Advantage" Over Us!
 - As A Church! As Christians!
 - This Does Not Mean That Satan Is More Powerful Than The Lord! But It Does Mean That Satan Is More Powerful Than You, When You Rely Upon Your Own Flesh!
 - And Satan Who Is Your Adversary & Enemy:
 - Will Try To Do Anything He Can:
 - To Eliminate Your Usefulness & Effectiveness As A Christian!
 - And He Is Relentless In His Attacks!
 - In Luke 22:31 Jesus Told Peter That:
 - Satan "Desired To Have" Him, So That He Might "Sift Him As Wheat!"
 - In 1 Peter 5:8 We Are Told That:
 - "The Devil, As A Roaring Lion, Walketh About, Seeking Whom He May Devour!"
 - And He Will Use Anything He Can:
 - To Do The Same To You!
 - But How?
- 3. Well Here In 2 Corinthians Paul Addresses One Way:
 - And One "Device" That Satan Has Always Used:
 - To Undermine The Spiritual Health:
 - Of Christians & Churches!
 - And That Is Bitterness!
 - Bitterness & Grudges Within Our Hearts!
 - What Is Bitterness?
 - Bitterness Is The Lack Of Forgiveness & A Forgiving Heart!
 - And It Is A Very Useful "Device" That Satan Can Use & Exploit:
 - To Sift Us / To Devour Us / To Gain An Advantage Over Us!
- 4. The Relationship That The Apostle Paul Had:
 - With The Corinthian Church:
 - Was A Turbulent One!
 - And Even When 2 Corinthians Was Written:
 - There Were Still Some In The Church Who Were Questioning His Authority & Were Making Accusations Against Him!
 - If Anyone Had The Right To Be Bitter It Probably Would Have Been Paul!
 - But Paul Sought To Live His Life:
 - With A Good & A Clear Conscience!
 - Before God & Before Men!
 - And So He Sought To Live His Life:
 - Transparently!
 - Truthfully!
 - And Tenderly!

- And This Kind Of Life:
 - Is Reflected To Us In His Words:
 - In The First Chapter Of This Letter:
 - Which We Have Already Looked At!
- And The Tender Heart:
 - That We Read About In 2:1-4:
 - We Continue To Sense As Paul Describes:
 - Another Issue & Another Sin That Took Place Against Him & The Church!
- 5. Now We Are Not Exactly Sure:
 - Who It Was That Offended Paul:
 - And Who It Was That Offended The Church:
 - But It Is Clear That When The Church There In Corinth Exercised Their Authority:
 - To Discipline That Member When He Repented Paul Was "Ready To Forgive!"
 - Paul Was "Ready To Forgive" Because:
 - He Know That If He Didn't:
 - Satan Was Ready To Use His Bitterness Against Him & The Church:
 - To Render Them Useless In The Work Of The Lord!
- 6. We Too Need To Be "Ready To Forgive!" Why? Four Reasons:
 - Because Of:

1. The Plan Of Forgiveness!

- We See The Plan Of Forgiveness:
 - In 2:5-6 "But if any have caused grief, he hath not grieved me, but in part: that I may not overcharge you all. / Sufficient to such a man is this punishment, which was inflicted of many!"
 - The Tender Heart That Paul Had For The Corinthian Church As A Whole:
 - Is Here Extended To A Single Member Who Had Offended Him Personally & Had Caused Him Grief & Sorrow!
 - But Just Listen To His Words!
- They Are Soft Words!
 - Verse 5 Is A Verse That Has Been Difficult To Translate:
 - But Paul Is Using Soft Words:
 - Against The Offending Member!
 - Proverbs 15:1 "A soft answer turneth away wrath: but grievous words stir up anger!"
 - He Is Saying That The Person Who Caused The Grief & Sorrow:
 - Only Did So "In Part!"
 - This Could Apply Either To:
 - Paul Or To The Church:
 - But Either Way Paul Did Not Wish To "Overcharge" And Increase The Load & Burden Either On The Church Or On The Individual Member!
 - Because Paul Was "Ready To Forgive!" Also:
- They Are Sensitive Words!
 - According To 2:6 It Is Clear That The Church:
 - Exercised Church Disciple On The Offending Member!
 - They Would Have Followed Jesus' Words In Matthew 18 And Eventually Brought The Matter To The Church As A Whole And "Punished" Him It Was "Inflicted Of Many!"
 - This Means That He Would Have Been Cast Out From The Membership Of The Church - And Treated As "An Heathen Man And A Publican!"
 - But Now Paul Writes That This Man's Punishment:
 - Was "Sufficient!"
 - It Was Enough!
 - Why? Because The Man Had Responded To The Discipline Of The Church!
 - And So They Needed To Be:
 - "Ready To Forgive" As Well!
- Because This Is The Ultimate Plan:
 - For Church Discipline & Forgiveness:
 - A Godly Sorrow & Repentance From Sin!

- Is This Your Goal When Someone Offends You Or Sins Against You?
 - Sometimes Someone Can Even Offend You Without Knowing It!
 - And Satan Can Use This To Drive A Wedge Between Christians!
- Remember 1 Peter 4:8 "And above all things have fervent charity among yourselves: for charity shall cover the multitude of sins!"
 - And Always Be "Ready To Forgive!"
 - Also Because Of:

2. The Purpose Of Forgiveness!

- We See The Purpose Of Forgiveness:
 - In 2:7-8 "So that contrariwise ye ought rather to forgive him, and comfort him, lest perhaps such a one should be swallowed up with overmuch sorrow. / Wherefore I beseech you that ye would confirm your love toward him!"
 - Here Paul Gives The Same Instruction To The Church As A Whole!
 - Paul Was "Ready To Forgive!"
 - Now They Needed To Forgive!
 - Perhaps There Were Some In The Church:
 - Who Did Not Believe That The Man Had Been Punished Enough!
 - Or Perhaps They Questioned The Sincerity Of His Sorrow & Repentance!
 - Paul Says To Them All "Forgive!"
- After All Forgiveness Is Part Of The Nature Of God Himself!
 - Psalm 103:8-18 "The LORD is merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and plenteous in mercy. / He will not always chide: neither will he keep his anger for ever. / He hath not dealt with us after our sins; nor rewarded us according to our iniquities. / For as the heaven is high above the earth, so great is his mercy toward them that fear him. / As far as the east is from the west, so far hath he removed our transgressions from us. / Like as a father pitieth his children, so the LORD pitieth them that fear him. / For he knoweth our frame; he remembereth that we are dust. / As for man, his days are as grass: as a flower of the field, so he flourisheth. / For the wind passeth over it, and it is gone; and the place thereof shall know it no more. / But the mercy of the LORD is from everlasting to everlasting upon them that fear him, and his righteousness unto children's children; / To such as keep his covenant, and to those that remember his commandments to do them!"
 - God Is A Forgiving God!
 - This Is The Good News Of The Gospel Itself!
 - That There Is Forgiveness Available To You When You Repent & Confess Your Sin & Believe In Jesus Christ As Your Own Savior From Sin!
 - And So It Is On The Basis Of God's Own Forgiveness:
 - That We Are To Forgive!
 - Ephesians 4:31-32 "Let all bitterness, and wrath, and anger, and clamour, and evil speaking, be put away from you, with all malice: / And be ye kind one to another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ's sake hath forgiven you!"
 - Are You "Ready To Forgive?"
 - Do Not Let Satan "Get An Advantage" Over You By Holding On To Bitterness!
 - Instead Remember The Purpose Of Forgiveness!
- To Comfort Each Other!
 - 2:7 "So that contrariwise ye ought rather to forgive him, and comfort him, lest perhaps such a one should be swallowed up with overmuch sorrow!"
 - Isn't This What Jesus Had Done For You?
 - When You Realized That You Sinned Against Him & Turned To Him In Repentance & Faith:
 - What Did Jesus Do?
 - Like The Father Of the Prodigal Son In Luke 15:18-24 "I will arise and go to my father, and will say unto him, Father, I have sinned against heaven, and before thee, / And am no more worthy to be called thy son: make me as one of thy hired servants. / And he arose, and came to his father. But when he was yet a great way off, his father saw him, and had compassion, and ran, and fell on his neck, and kissed him. / And the son said unto him, Father, I have sinned against heaven, and in thy sight, and am no more worthy to be called thy son. / But the father said to his servants, Bring forth the best robe, and put it on him; and put a ring on his hand, and shoes on his feet: / And bring hither the fatted calf, and kill it; and let us eat, and be merry: / For this my son was dead, and is alive again; he was lost, and is found. And they began to be

merry!"

- What A Comfort For This Prodigal Son!
 - He Was Restored!
 - This Is The Purpose Of Forgiveness!
 - We Also Need:
- To Confirm Each Other!
 - 2:8 "Wherefore I beseech you that ye would confirm your love toward him!"
 - We Need To Always Be Ready:
 - To Assure One Another:
 - Of Our Love Especially When Someone Repents Of Their Sin!
- This Is The Purpose Of Forgiveness!
 - To Restore A Fallen Brother Or Sister In Christ:
 - To The Fellowship & The Favor:
 - Of The Church!
 - This Is What Christ-Like Love Is!
 - This Is What Christ-Like Love Does!
 - Are You "Ready To Forgive" In This Way?
 - Willing To Comfort & Confirm Your Love:
 - To Someone Who Has Offended You & The Church & Even The Lord?
 - When They Return Do Not Remain Bitter! Do Not Hold Grudges! Instead Remember:

3. The Point Of Forgiveness!

- We See The Point Of Forgiveness:
 - In 2:9 "For to this end also did I write, that I might know the proof of you, whether ye be obedient in all things!"
 - Every Instruction That Paul Gave & Every Letter That Paul Wrote:
 - Was For A Reason!
 - And So Here We Even See:
- The Reason For A Forgiving Spirit!
 - Paul Wrote:
 - "That I Might Know The Proof Of You!"
 - That Is To Test Them & Their Character, To See What Kind Of Church They Had Become!
 - IE: One Definition Of "Character" Is What You Are Like When You Are All Alone!
 - Paul Wanted To Know If They Would Be A Christ-Like Church!
 - Not Only When He Was With Them, But Even When He Was Not!
 - Like The Philippian Church Philippians 2:12 "Wherefore, my beloved, as ye have always obeyed, not as in my presence only, but now much more in my absence, work out your own salvation with fear and trembling!"
 - A Forgiving Spirit:
 - Is The Evidence & Proof:
 - That Christ Himself Is In Our Midst!
 - We Also See:
- The Response Of A Forgiving Spirit!
 - In 2:9 Paul Adds "Whether Ye Be Obedient In All Things!"
 - When Paul Instructed The Church:
 - To Confront Sin:
 - They Obeyed! But Now:
 - As Paul Instructs Them:
 - To Forgive Sin!
 - Would They Obey?
- The Point Of Forgiveness:
 - Is To Respond To The Will Of God:
 - Even When You Have Been Offended & Hurt!
 - Will You Obey The Lord In All Things?
 - Remember Colossians 3:12-13 "Put on therefore, as the elect of God, holy and beloved, bowels of mercies, kindness, humbleness of mind, meekness, longsuffering; / Forbearing one another, and forgiving

one another, if any man have a quarrel against any: even as Christ forgave you, so also do ye!"

- Are You "Ready To Forgive?"
 - Also Because Of:

4. The Power Of Forgiveness!

- We See The Power Of Forgiveness:
 - In 2:10 "To whom ye forgive any thing, I forgive also: for if I forgave any thing, to whom I forgave it, for your sakes forgave I it in the person of Christ!"
 - We Need To Always Be "Ready To Forgive" Because:
- Forgiveness Settles:
 - The Offense To The Church!
 - Paul Wrote "To Whom Ye Forgive Any Thing, I Forgive Also!"
 - Even Though Paul Was An Apostle, And May Have Been Personally Offended, He Extended The Power Of Forgiveness To Them!
 - What They Forgave He Would Forgive How They Handled The Matter He Would Accept And It Would Be Settled!
 - And When We Are "Ready To Forgive" In This Way:
 - Satan Will Never Be Able To Use:
 - Bitterness To "Get An Advantage Of Us!"
- Forgiveness Strengthens:
 - The Fellowship Of The Church!
 - Paul Also Wrote "For If I Forgave Any Thing, To Whom I Forgave It, For Your Sakes Forgave It!"
 - Paul Understood The Power Of Forgiveness!
 - When You Maintain A Bitter Spirit:
 - Toward Those Who Have Sinned Against You:
 - It Affects The Church!
 - It Is Unprofitable!
 - But When You Maintain A Forgiving Spirit:
 - It Also Affects The Church!
 - It Benefits The Church!
 - It Strengthens The Church!
 - And When You Are "Ready To Forgive" In This Way:
 - Satan Will Never Be Able To:
 - Drive Any Kind Of Wedge Into The Fellowship Of The Church!
- Forgiveness Satisfies:
 - The Head Of The Church:
 - Jesus Christ Himself!
 - At The End Of 2:10 Paul Wrote "For your sakes forgave I it in the person of Christ!"
 - Remember Paul Sought To Live His Life:
 - Always Before The "Face Of God!"
 - And In The "Presence / Person Of Jesus Christ Himself!"
 - Forgiveness:
 - Reflects The Heart & Purpose Of Jesus!
 - And That Is Why Forgiveness Pleases & Satisfies Him As Well!
- Forgiveness Brings Reconciliation!
 - With Christ & With Other Christians!
 - This Is The Great Power Of Forgiveness!

Conclusion:

- 1. So Are You "Ready To Forgive?"
 - Remember In Matthew 18:21-22 When Peter Asked Jesus:
 - "Lord, how oft shall my brother sin against me, and I forgive him? till seven times? / Jesus saith unto him, I say not unto thee, Until seven times: but, Until seventy times seven!"
 - Don't Let Satan:
 - "Get An Advantage" Over You!
 - Do Not Be "Ignorant Of His Devices!"
 - He Will Always Use Bitterness To Divide & To Disrupt & To Devour:

- You & Keep You From Pleasing & Serving The Lord Effectively!

- 2. Remember The:
 - Plan Of Forgiveness:
 - To Bring Those Who Sin To Repentance!
 - Purpose Of Forgiveness:
 - To Restore Those Who Confess Their Sins Against You!
 - Point Of Forgiveness:
 - To Respond To The Will Of God In Obedience!
 - Power Of Forgiveness:
 - To Reconcile Sinners To Christ & His Church!
- 3. After All:
 - Isn't This What The Lord Has Done For You?
 - Psalm 86:5 "For thou, Lord, art good, and ready to forgive; and plenteous in mercy unto all them that call upon thee!"
 - Be "Ready To Forgive" In Your Heart As Well!
 - 2:11 "Lest Satan should get an advantage of us: for we are not ignorant of his devices!"
 - Be "Ready To Forgive!"

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
