Exodus 20:18-21

Drawing Near vs. Standing Far Off

¹⁸ Now when all the people *saw* the thunder and the flashes of lightning and the sound of the trumpet and the mountain smoking, *the people were afraid and trembled, and they stood far off* ¹⁹ and said to Moses, "You speak to us, and we will listen; but do not let God speak to us, lest we die." ²⁰ Moses said to the people, "Do not fear, for God has come to test you, that the fear of him may be before you, that you may not sin." ²¹ The people stood far off, while Moses drew near to the thick darkness where God was.

- 1. How Did the People Respond to God's Revelation?
- 2. Moses Interceded as Covenant Mediator.
- 3. The Invitation to Draw Near Is Still Open.

CONCLUSION: God closes the Decalogue in the same way He began it—with grace. The One who saved the people would be the One to draw near to them as Immanuel, God with us. We, like our spiritual forebears, are often tempted to flee from God in trembling fear. We are much more comfortable with our sin than with a God who is truly holy and beckons us to join Him in righteousness. The resurrection of Jesus, our greater Moses, is the only way for us to conquer our terror and enjoy the fear of the Lord that is the beginning of wisdom.

Westminster Larger Catechism

Q. 152. What does *every sin deserve* at the hands of God?

A. Every sin, even the least, *being against the sovereignty, goodness, and holiness of God, and against his righteous law,* deserves his wrath and curse, both in this life, and that which is to come; and cannot be expiated but by the blood of Christ.

- **Q.** 153. What does God require of us, that we may escape his wrath and curse due to us by reason of the transgression of the law?
- **A.** That we may escape the wrath and curse of God due to us by reason of the transgression of the law, he *requires* of us repentance toward God, and faith toward our Lord Jesus Christ, and the diligent use of the outward means whereby Christ communicates to us the benefits of his mediation.

- **Q.** 154. What are the outward means whereby Christ communicates to us the benefits of his mediation?
- **A.** The outward and ordinary means whereby Christ communicates to his church the benefits of his mediation, are all his ordinances; especially the Word, Sacraments, and prayer: all which are made effectual to the elect for their salvation.

Matt. 28:19-20; Acts 2:42, 46-47.

- **Q.** 155. How is the Word made effectual to salvation?
- A. The Spirit of God makes the reading, but especially the preaching of the Word, an effectual means of enlightening, convincing, and humbling sinners; of driving them out of themselves, and drawing them unto Christ; of conforming them to his image, and subduing them to his will; of strengthening them against temptations and corruptions; of building them up in grace, and establishing their hearts in holiness and comfort through faith unto salvation.

Taking Gathered Worship Home

Sunday Morning

READ Exodus 20:18-21; Hebrews 4:14-16; 7:22-28; Deut 20:1-4; Ecclesiastes 5:1-7; Isaiah 29:13-16; 45:18-25; Zephaniah 3:1-2; Luke 15:1-2; James 4:6-12; Psalm 119:145-176. DISCUSS What have you learned about the Decalogue? What has surprised you? Challenged you? What is the significance of the people standing at a distance? How can we draw near? MEDITATE on Hebrews 11:6 and Westminster Larger Catechism #152-55. PRAY "Immanuel, God with us, You have drawn near to us that we might draw near to You. We praise You!"

Monday

READ Exodus 20:18-21; Hebrews 4:14-16; Isaiah 45:18-25; Psalm 119:145-176. DISCUSS In both Hebrews and Isaiah there is a reminder of what God has done followed by a command for what we should do. How does that relate to drawing near? On what basis? SERVE Demonstrate love for God through reaching out to someone in need! MEDITATE on Hebrews 11:6 and Westminster Larger Catechism #152-55. PRAY "Immanuel, You have drawn near to us. Enable us to continue to draw near to you with confidence in Christ alone."

Tuesday

READ Exodus 20:18-21; Hebrews 7:22-28; Psalm 119:145-176. DISCUSS In whom are we drawing near to God? How securely is He saving us? What do we know about the Son? SERVE Draw near to someone in Christ's name. MEDITATE on Hebrews 11:6 and Westminster Larger Catechism #152-55. PRAY "Immanuel, You have rescued us. We are gladly Yours alone."

Wednesday

READ Exodus 20:18-21; Deuteronomy 20:1-4; Ecclesiastes 5:1-7; Romans 5:1-11; Psalm 119:145-176. DISCUSS What are the two kinds of fear in these texts? How is fear of the Lord different from fear of man? MEDITATE on Luke 1:57-58 and Westminster Larger Catechism #147-9. PRAY "Immanuel, please free us from the fear of men, that we rightly fear You and draw near."

Thursday

READ Exodus 20:18-21; Luke 15:1-2; James 4:6-12; Psalm 119:145-176. DISCUSS In Luke's Gospel who was rejoicing and drawing near Jesus? Who was grumbling? Why? SERVE Demonstrate delight by putting someone else's interests *above your own*! MEDITATE on Hebrews 11:6 and Westminster Larger Catechism #152-55. PRAY "Immanuel, You are all that we need. Make our hearts grateful in You."

Friday

READ Exodus 20:18-21; Hebrews 4:14-16; 7:22-28; Deut 20:1-4; Ecclesiastes 5:1-7; Isaiah 29:13-16; 45:18-25; Zephaniah 3:1-2; Luke 15:1-2; James 4:6-12; Psalm 119:145-176. DISCUSS What has God been teaching you this week? SERVE by *caring for someone in need!* MEDITATE on **Hebrews 11**:6 and *Westminster Larger Catechism* #152-55. PRAY for God to continue to revive and refresh FCCW.

Saturday

PREPARE today for gathered Sunday worship tomorrow. READ Luke1:1-2:52. Invite others to join you tomorrow for the worship service @ 10:30 am.
