# HC 99 - Proper Worship: It must be done reverently

Brothers and Sisters in Jesus Christ: What is the 3<sup>rd</sup> law?

<u>Exodus 20:</u>7 - You shall not take the name of the LORD your God in vain, for the LORD will not hold him quiltless who takes His name in vain.

Many don't understand this command so they don't obey it like they should. Others don't care about obeying this command because they do not see immediate penalties from God for abusing it. And even with much abuse of God's name among Christians, I have yet to hear of a case where a church disciplined someone for consistently misusing God's name. At the same time, I can well imagine the hurt that God's own people cause him when they display ignorance 无知 and/or arrogance 傲慢 in misusing his name.

Keep in mind that while this command is narrowly focused on using God's name in worship, the intention of the law if very broad and covers misuse of God's name in any way. As usual, we will deal with the narrow and the broad meaning, the letter and the intention of this law.

Our headings are:

Our goals are: That you will <u>learn what is prohibited and what is prescribed by the law</u>, that you will <u>be thankful that Jesus Christ kept this law for you</u>, and that you <u>will teach this law to your children</u> and those under your care.

99 Q. WHAT IS GOD'S WILL FOR US IN THE THIRD COMMANDMENT?

A. That we neither <u>blaspheme 亵渎</u> nor misuse the <u>name</u> of God by <u>cursing</u>, <u>perjury 伪证</u>, or <u>unnecessary oaths 宣誓</u>, nor share in such horrible sins by <u>being silent bystanders 旁观者</u>. In a word, it requires that we <u>use the holy name of God only with reverence 尊敬 and awe 敬畏</u>, so that we may properly confess him, pray to him, and praise him in everything we do and say.

### **Prohibitions of Law 3**

- 1. Following the letter of the law, God prohibits blaspheming his name the name of God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit at any time, especially in worship.
  - a. "Blaspheme" means to speak wickedly or irreverently 无礼 about God.
  - b. "Name" represents the person. So "don't misuse God's name" means don't be irreverent to any aspect of God's name and nature.
- 2. Following the spirit of the law, see how God prohibits you from cursing others.

(This is not speaking of vulgar 庸俗 language. Vulgar language is bad, but that breaks other commands — like the 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup>.)

Rather, cursing means to use God's name to call down God's judgment on something or someone. For example, you might hear the term "God damn you." Or you might hear: "Go to hell." These statements are actually curses-the worst curses possible. Those who curse in these ways should be afraid because they are acting like God, pronouncing judgment. But no individual has that right. In Israel, the violator of this law was put to death.

Leviticus 24: 10 Now the son of an Israelite woman, whose father was an Egyptian, went out among the children of Israel; and this Israelite woman's son and a man of Israel fought each other in the camp. 11 And the Israelite woman's son blasphemed the name of the LORD and cursed; and so they brought him to Moses. (His mother's name was Shelomith the daughter of Dibri, of the tribe of Dan.) 12 Then they put him in custody, that the mind of the LORD might be shown to them. 13 And the LORD spoke to Moses, saying, 14 "Take outside the camp him who has cursed; then let all who heard him lay their hands on his head, and let all the congregation stone him. 15 "Then you shall speak to the children of Israel, saying: 'Whoever curses his God shall bear his sin. 16 'And whoever blasphemes the name of the LORD shall surely be put to death. All the congregation shall certainly stone him, the stranger as well as him who is born in the land. When he blasphemes the name of the LORD, he shall be put to death.

Further, some men often show little regard for God's name by calling him to curse a hammer, a dog, snow, or even a car tire. **Only if you think too much of yourself would you demand that God curse things that you want to curse**. But God is judge, not you.

#### 3. God prohibits you from perjuring yourself through making lying oaths.

Perjury is lying under oath, usually in a civil matter, as in a court.

Leviticus 19: 12 'And you shall not swear by My name falsely, nor shall you profane 渎 the name of your God: I am the LORD.

<u>Proverbs 29:24</u> Whoever is a partner with a thief <u>hates his</u> own life; <u>He swears to tell the truth, but reveals nothing.</u>

The man in Proverbs 29, who committed perjury by hiding the truth, could have been put to death for perjury. But whatever the punishment he was trying to put on the falsely accused God required that the court put it on him.

#### 4. God prohibits you from making unnecessary oaths.

Only important things require oath taking. So when someone takes an oath it shows that that thing is important.

<u>Matthew 5: 33</u> "Again you have heard that it was said to those of old, 'You shall not swear falsely, but shall perform your oaths to the Lord.' 34 "But I say to you, do not swear at all: neither by <u>heaven</u>, for it is God's throne; 35 "nor by the <u>earth</u>, for it is His footstool; nor by <u>Jerusalem</u>, for it is the city of the great King. 36 "Nor shall you swear by <u>your head</u>, because you cannot make one hair white or black. 37 "But let your 'Yes' be 'Yes,' and your 'No,' 'No.' For whatever is more than these is from the evil one. (See James 5:12 also.)

The Jews corrupted oath taking (swearing) in two ways, and both done so they would look good.

<u>a. The Jews took oaths for minor things – not just for important things like marriage or ministerial vows</u>. But because they were taking oaths, the people thought more highly of them.

**b.** The Jews took oaths by the temple, or the gold in the temple; they did not take oaths using God's name as they should. But because they were taking oaths, the people thought more highly of them.

### 5. God prohibits you from making rash 皮疹 oaths.

These oaths might include those who <u>rush into marriage without giving it much thought</u>, or like those who desire the office of the <u>church without thinking of the responsibilities</u>, or like Jephthah who rashly promised to give "whatever met him first on his return home from war <u>as a sacrifice to God</u>," and then he was promptly greeted by his daughter -an only child. Jud 11:30-31.

### 6. God prohibits you from being silent by-standers when God's name is abused.

<u>Leviticus 5:1</u> 'If a person sins in hearing the utterance of an oath, and is a witness, whether he has seen or known of the matter —if he does not tell it, he bears guilt.

But you have to understand this in context. If you are around those who believe and know better (Christians), you have a responsibility to speak up. If you are in your home, you must speak up. If you are limited by your location, like in a political meeting, you are not free to defend the honor of God name there. You will have to be quiet there.

Also, you must set an example of how to properly use God's name. Even in a non-Christian environment as your workplace, you can explain why you will not sit with those who misuse God's name regularly. Or people might observe that you don't misuse God's name. Doing that may give you an opportunity to share the Gospel. Living as a Christian is not a Sunday affair. You have to reflect your God throughout the week.

## 7. What are some specific illustrative examples of how God's name can be misused?

a. 1Samuel 17 <u>— Goliath laughed at the thought of God name</u>...God's ability to save Israel.

b. Isaiah 36 <u>— The Rabshakeh, Ambassador for the Assyrian King...mocked God's ability to protect Israel</u> during Hezekiah's days as king of Judah.

c. <u>Jackie Kennedy</u>, <u>wife of assassinated US President John F. Kennedy</u>, <u>said that God had failed him</u> because God didn't keep Kennedy to improve the world. First, she thought too highly of President Kennedy. Second, she thought too little of God.

# **Prescriptions of Law 3**

99 Q. WHAT IS GOD'S WILL FOR US IN THE THIRD COMMANDMENT?

A. .... In a word, it requires that we <u>use the holy name of God only with reverence and awe</u> so that we may properly confess him, <u>pray to him</u>, and <u>praise him</u> in everything we <u>do and say</u>.

1. When one thing is forbidden, the opposite is required.

If you must use God name, as the redeemed of God through Christ, you must use it properly – in a holy way.

2. As the redeemed of God, you must show reverence when using God's name in your conversations with him (worship) and with others (work). Look at 2 examples.

Psalm 99:1 The LORD reigns 统治; Let the peoples tremble! He dwells between the cherubim; Let the earth be moved! 2 The LORD is great in Zion, And He is high above all the peoples. 3 Let them praise Your great and awesome name—He is holy. 4 The King's strength also loves justice; You have established equity; You have executed justice and righteousness in Jacob. 5 Exalt the LORD our God, And worship at His footstool—He is holy.

Matthew 10:32 "Therefore whoever confesses Me before men, him I will also confess before My Father who is in heaven. 33 "But whoever denies Me before men, him I will also deny before My Father who is in heaven.

Think of God's name when you use it. Don't be afraid to use God's name as the Jews, which caused them to forget how to pronounce it. Rather, use God's name with proper care and reverence.

<u>Jeremiah 4:2</u> And you shall swear, 'The LORD lives,' In truth, in judgment, and in righteousness; The nations shall bless themselves in Him, And in Him they shall glory."

### 3.As the redeemed of God, you must use his name reverently in prayer.

God is holy and worthy of honor by all, but his children are the only ones able to do it. Only they have access to him.

<u>1Timothy 2:8</u> I desire therefore that the men pray everywhere, <u>lifting up holy hands</u>, <u>without wrath and doubting</u>:

<u>Colossians 3:17</u> And whatever you do in word or deed, <u>do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks</u> to God the Father through Him.

### 4. As the redeemed of God you must praise holy God in a reverent way.

<u>Psalm 50:14</u> Offer to God thanksgiving, <u>And pay your vows to the Most High</u>. 15 Call upon Me in the day of trouble; I will deliver you, and you shall glorify Me."

Take note of the promise that is attached to the command here: if you reverently use God's name you can expect that, as his child, he will deliver you from your troubles that the Sneaky Snake might cause you.

# 5. As the redeemed of God, you must promote God's greatness and honor.

Remember that "name" represents the person.

- a. When you promote the greatness and honor of God <u>vou open the world to be evangelized</u>.
- b. When you promote God's greatness and honor you encourage Christians to live more sanctified lives.
- c. When you promote the greatness and honor of God you <u>help to establish justice</u> especially when you use speak in legal situations. <u>This helps to keep civil peace</u>, which is a benefit to Christians as well.

# 6. As the redeemed of God, you must honor God's name by your life.

Notice how the catechism answer ends: You are to praise God by what you "do and say." The Christian life is more than talk. You show regard for God's name and person by how you live in front of all men.

7. You will notice from these prescriptions that you are unable to fulfill them, but you will remember that Jesus Christ kept this law for you. So don't be overwhelmed by the demands of this law. He was accused of blasphemy, but he never blasphemed his Father. His obedience is credited as yours.

### Conclusion:

God strongly forbids the misusing of his name in any way. It is hurtful to him when you misuse his name by what you say, do and think. He threatens 威胁 judgment on those who misuse his name. On the other hand, God wants you to use him name with proper awe and respect, which brings glory and worship to him. God promises heavenly blessings on those who properly use his name.

Brothers and Sisters in Jesus Christ: It is not easy to use God's name reverently.

- 1. You have to know who God is and what he has done in order to use his name properly. So study and teach the Bible well. Why do you think OMG is so widely used by Christians today? It is from a lack of knowledge. Christians aren't that wicked, but we are that ignorant.
- **2.** You also have to correct the misuse of God's name. Challenge those around you. You might have to say: Did you really mean to call on God's? Do you really wish that that person be damned in the tortures of hell forever? Do you know what hell is like? You see, speaking up opens up an opportunity to share the Gospel.
- 3. Let you mind be drawn to God, his greatness and his goodness, when you worship him. Let him fill you with his awesomeness and his full love. Then you can truly worship him and use his name with appropriate reverence.

Finally, God is not some generic grandfather, or someone whose name you call when you stump your toe. He is the holy one of heaven and earth...the one with your death sentence recorded in his book because you are a sinner

by birth and by actions. This just God is also gracious. He opens to you the way back to him and offers his substituted Son to take your punishment. Won't you ask for this freedom from sin?
