- Desires for obedience, confession of sin Ps. 119:8, 17, 34, 88; Ps. 51:1-3
- Persistence and determination Deut. 9:18
- Genuine humility 2 Chron. 7:14; Ezra 8:21; Ps. 10:17

- 2) The Pattern Requested by a Disciple v. 1

When you pray... NOT...if you pray

- a) Vertical
 - 1. Paternity "Father"

Corporate vs. Individual (1 Chron. 29:10; Is. 63:16; Rom. 8:15)

The Perfect Father (Matt. 7:9-11)

2. Priority - "hallowed be Your name" Ps. 9:10; 20:7; Ex. 33:19; Neh. 9:5

3. Program - "Your kingdom come"

Your NOT My

Ruler—a kingdom involves a ruler with rightful and adequate authority and power.

Realm—a kingdom involves a realm of subjects to be ruled.

Rulership—a kingdom involves the exercise of ruling.

Universal - the extent of rule; God's eternal rule over all creation.

Mediatorial - the method of rule; God's rule on the earth through man who acts as God's representative.
