The New Covenant is better than the Old Covenant because: 1. The Priest is better. 2. The Priest brings a better sacrifice. 3. The Priest brings His sacrifice to a better place. 4. The Priest has perfectly represented us to God. Hebrews	
First, he states how a High Priest comes to be. Hebrews	
God chose and appointed the Old Covenant Priest to be Aaron and the New Covenant Priest to be Jesus Christ. Hebrews	
Exodus 28:1-3	

Numbers 18:1-7 Hebrews	
God made it abundantly clear that there was no general admittance to His alter or to His mercy seat. Hebrews	
If anyone chose to go directly to God without God's High Priest, they were to be put to death. Hebrews	
God sets the rules for His mercy and grace, not man. Hebrews	
Second, he states what the purpose is of a High Priest. Hebrews	

Third, he gives the exact job description of a High Priest. Hebrews	
God did not allow any creative license of dealing with sin. Hebrews	
God creates right religion; man creates false religion. Hebrews

- 2 How could you help a person to determine if they truly have Christ as their priest who has provided eternal salvation for them even though they still struggle with sin?
 - 2.a Could passages like 1 John 2:1 and Romans 8:34 help? Can you think of others that might help as well?
- 3 God was extremely specific about the priestly role of representing the people of God to God by sacrifice. How does this point to the exclusivity of Jesus Christ for salvation in our day?
- 4 Trivia: In the Garden Jesus prayed so earnestly that he sweat drops of blood, was close to dying, and an angel was even sent to care for him. When else were angels sent to care for Jesus?
- 5 Those who tried to get to God any other way than how God commanded would be put to death. Even the priest and the High Priest had to do things exactly as God had prescribed or they too would be put to death. How does our world view such regulation and limitations of access to God?
