of the Old Covenant

Shadow/reality: Animals/Christ's body (10:1-4)

Christ: The willing sacrifice (10:5-10)

The uniqueness and finality of Christ's priesthood (11-13)

The Levitical priests: Stand daily

Christ: Once seated at the right hand (Hebrews 1:3)

The Divinity of Christ

Until His enemies should be made a footstool (Psalm 110)
