POWER TO OPEN AND TO SHUT THE KINGDOM: PREACHING

Intro: - The kingdom of heaven is opened and shut by the public proclamation of God's gospel.

- But it must be God's gospel, that is, the gospel that is true according to Scripture, the pure preaching of the Word.
- Even while many today are forsaking the preaching of the gospel, we need to know that God commands the church to do it!

I. THE MESSAGE OF THE PREACHING:

- A. Preaching the message of the gospel.
 - 1. Many names given to it: Christ's gospel, the gospel of God, Paul calls it 'his gospel', the gospel of salvation, of peace.
 - 2. The word gospel means "good news".
 - 3. It is the good news to those in darkness, misery, and death that there is deliverance.
 - 4. It is good news because of the unspeakably great riches of the inheritance that is promised.
- B. Preaching the particular content of the gospel
 - 1. The content of the preaching is the **promise/promises** of Christ Jesus.
 - 2. Of this promise, the OT saints died in faith, not having received the promises, but saw from afar & embraced them.
 - 3. In Gal. 3, we see that Christ the Seed is the fulfillment of the promise and the recipient of the promise.
 - 4. If we are Christ's, we are Abraham's seed and heirs according to the promise. The promise comes to the elect (Acts 2:39).
 - 5. In short, the promise is Christ and all his riches of salvation and blessing. This includes:
 - 6. The promise is unconditional and the promise is as faithful and true as God is unchangeable. He will realize his promise.
- C. The **preaching** of the promise of the gospel.
 - 1. When we speak of the key-power, we are not speaking of the promise of God as such, but the preaching of the promise.
 - 2. "According to the command of Christ it is declared and publicly testified to....."
 - 3. God proclaims the promise, but he does it through the agency of men. Therefore it is authoritative.
 - 4. God commands the church to preach the gospel. Therefore it is an official work and message.
 - 5. Because it pleases Christ to speak his own Word, the preaching becomes effective as a key-power.
- D. How Christ exercises this power? Positively and negatively:
 - 1. Christ **opens** the kingdom through the pure preaching. It is declared that believing in Jesus Christ one is saved!
 - 2. By faith the child of God is conscious that all his sins are really forgiven for the sake of Christ's merits.
 - 3. By this same preaching, it is declared to all unbelievers & unrepentant that they stand exposed to the wrath of God.
 - 4. God will judge them both in this life and in the life to come. Many do not like this negative element! **Closed!**

II. THE PARTICULAR OBJECTS OF THE PREACHING:

- A. The preaching is to be promiscuous.
 - 1. God gives to the church an open door to preach. Paul speaks of that door in our passage (vs.12). Other passages:
 - 2. The truth is that God directs his church where and to whom she brings the glorious gospel.
 - 3. We scatter the seed promiscuously, not knowing who the elect are. (See Belgic Conf. II art 5.)
 - 4. Nor does this mean that we have nothing to say to the unconverted who are among the hearers.
 - 5. Always we say, "Thus saith the Lord."
 - 6. The Word preached is a declaration, a testimony from God, not an offer. Then salvation would be a work of man accepting
- B. The gospel we preach is particular. It is not good news to everyone!
 - 1. While the preaching of the promise is promiscuous, the promise itself is particular.
 - 2. In our own history as churches there was the error of those who taught that the promise was general, to all who hear.
 - 3. That made the promise conditional upon the response of the individual to believe.
 - 4. The Catechism emphatically says that we declare and testify to all & every believer, receiving the promise by true faith...
 - 5. The promise is made to believers, those in whom the Spirit works faith, those who are the elect of God.
 - 6. The preaching of the gospel and the covenant of God are governed by God's election.
- C. The warning that comes to the unbelieving and unrepentant.
 - 1. It is likewise declared & testified to all unbelievers and those who do not sincerely repent that they stand exposed to wrath.
 - 2. God uses such warnings and threatening to call his elect people from the heathen and call back backsliding saints.
 - 3. But God also uses these warnings to leave the wicked without excuse. They heard the Word and rejected it.
 - 4. The kingdom is shut to those who remain unconverted and unrepentant!
- D. The preaching is always a sweet savor to God.
 - 1. Paul rejoices because God causes his gospel to triumph, spreading abroad the fragrance of Christ.
 - 2. The goal of Paul's ministry was that Christ should be known. God diffuses that knowledge everywhere.
 - 3. The preaching is well-pleasing to God whatever the effect the preaching produces. It is never neutral!
 - 4. The gospel preached is a savor of life unto life! Christ is a cornerstone that saves.
 - 5. To the wicked, the gospel preached is a savor of death unto death. Christ is a stone of offense and destroys.

III. THE ETERNAL VALIDITY OF PREACHING AS KEY POWER:

- A. What the church binds on earth is bound in heaven.
 - 1. 'To bind' is a rabbinical term meaning to forbid (beliefs and conduct) and excluding those who continue in it.
 - 2. Does any hear in the preaching, "you are excluded?" That testimony is valid and true.
 - 3. God's Word is valid now on earth and in the church, and is valid into eternity. Shut out, excluded from the kingdom.
 - 4. In love for souls the church preaches it, and in love may who hear the Word repent of their sins and believe!
- B. What the church looses on earth is loosed in heaven.
 - 1. 'To loose' is a term that means to loose from judgment and condemnation and the admitting into church membership.
 - 2. Do you hear by faith in the preaching, "your sins are forgiven", entrance is given to you. Valid today and into eternity!
