**“Guiding Light from the Lampstand”**

Zechariah 4

- I. Zechariah sees an image of a \_\_\_\_\_ (4:1-3).
  - a. When he asks for the meaning of the vision, he is given a message to Zerubbabel that the work of God is not accomplished through \_\_\_\_\_  
might and power (4:4-6).
  - b. The mountain of God, previously a mountain of \_\_\_\_\_, will be cleared and transformed into a temple (4:7).
