

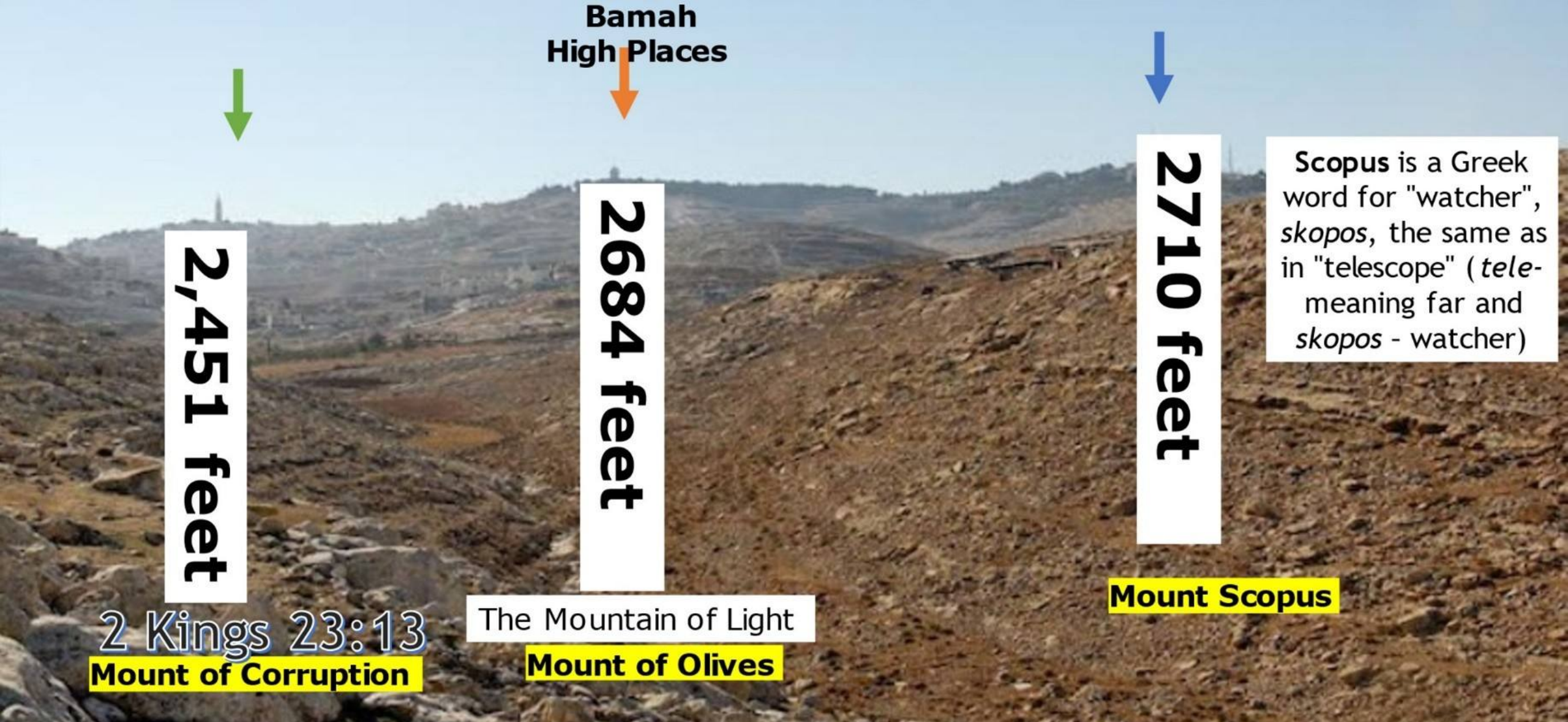

Mount Scopus

Scopus is a Greek word for "watcher", *skopos*, the same as in "telescope" (*tele-* meaning far and *skopos* - watcher)

The Mount of Olives is mentioned some **twelve times** in the New Testament, but only **twice** by name in the Old (**2 Sam. 15:30; Zech. 14:4**). There are however, other references to it there, where it is described as **"the mountain which is on the east side of the city"** (Ezek. 11:23), and **"the hill that is before Jerusalem"** (1 Kings 11:7).

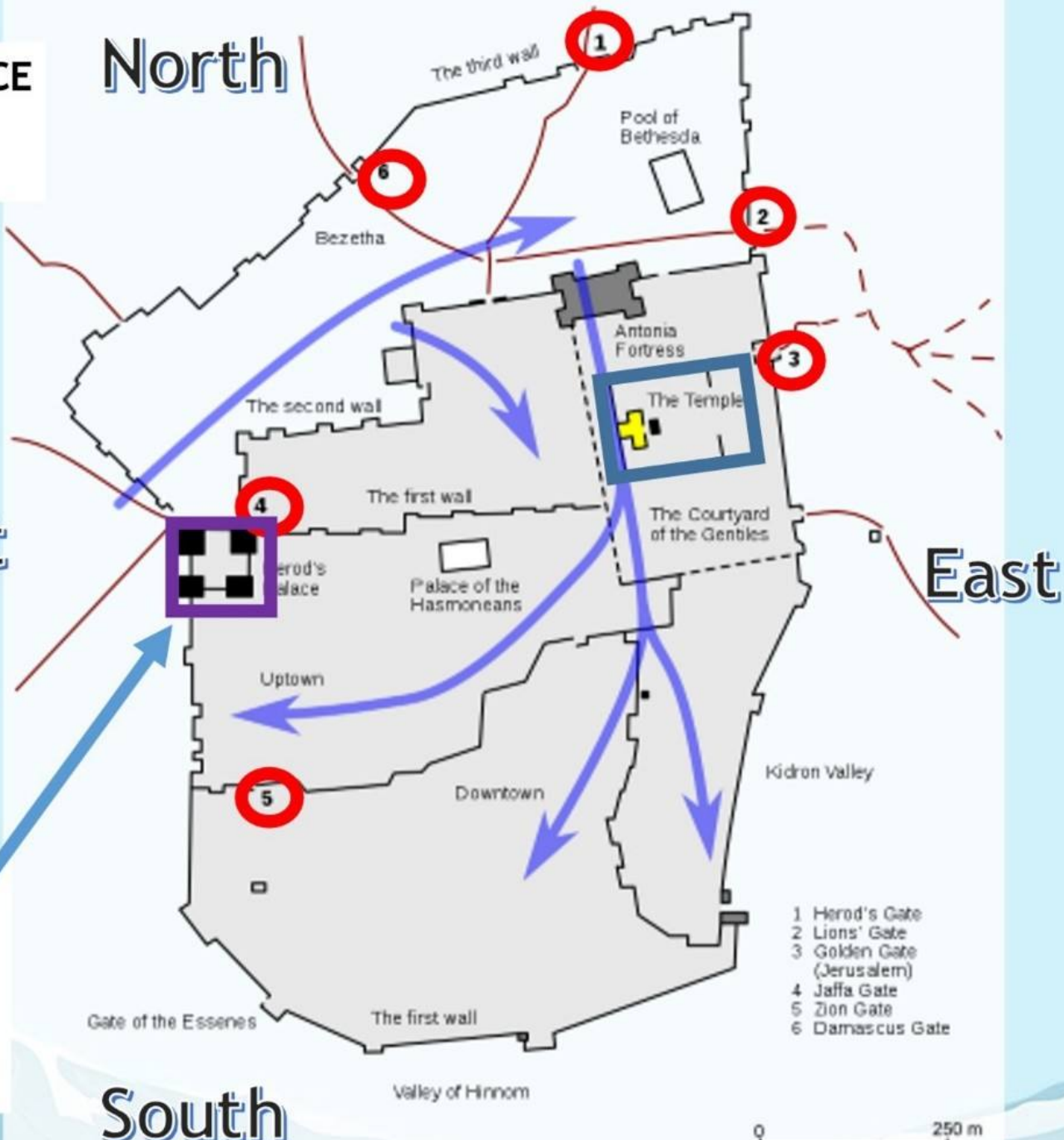

The Mount of Olives was called the Mountain of Light for several reasons.

1. To catch the rays of light of the sun each day.
2. The lamps of the Temple lit up the whole western side of the **Mount of Olives**.
3. This was the mountain where the great fire was lit by the priests for burning the red heifer sacrifice.
4. The olive trees provided oil for lamps in the Temple.
5. You could see the world far and wide. It was also the most delightful area to behold Jerusalem.
6. This was the place where the Light of the World, the Lord **Jesus Christ**, was crucified and where He will return one day.



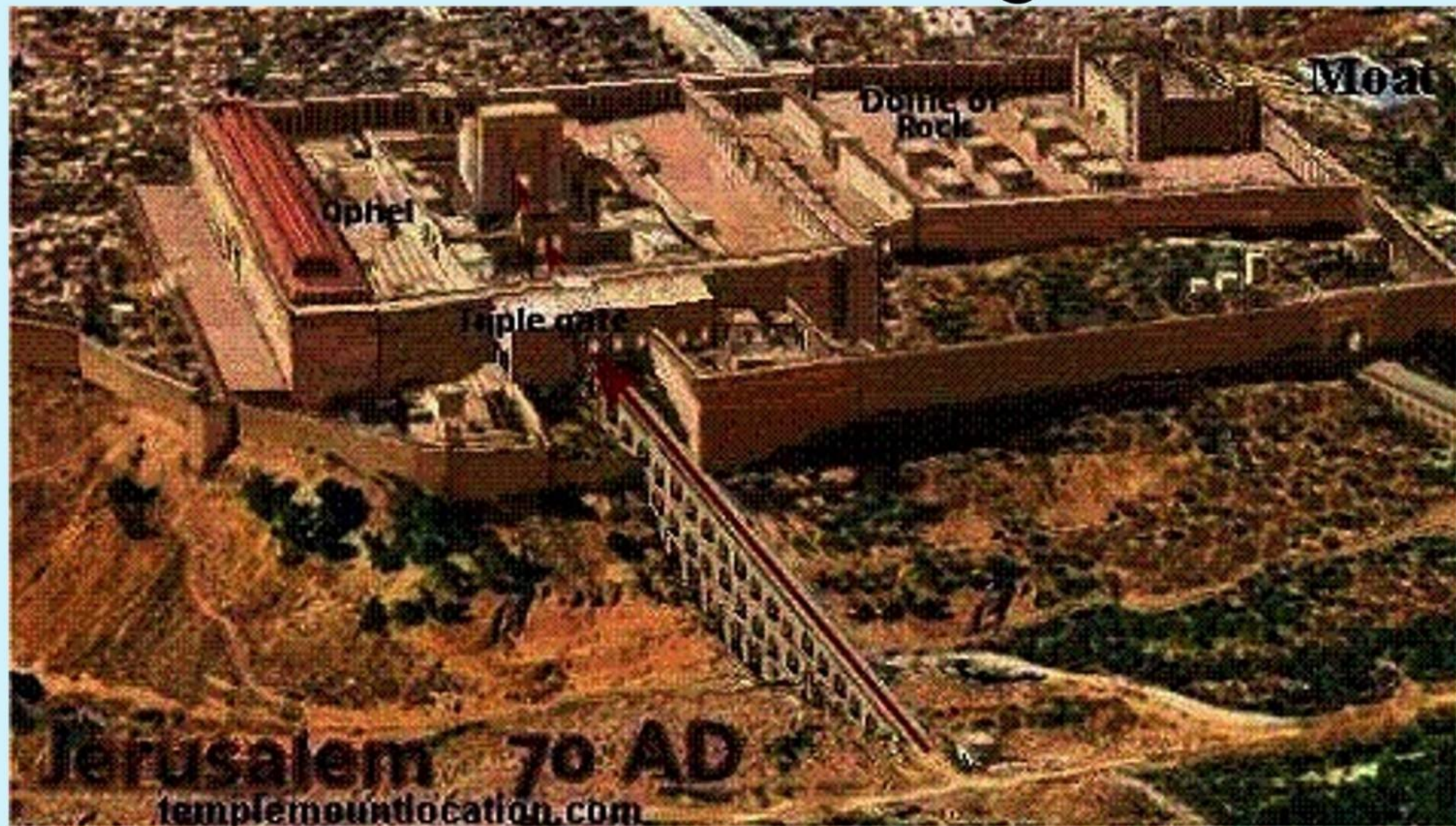
Red Heifer Bridge



The Temple mount looked very different before the Temple was destroyed. The whole section of what Solomon's Stables, left of Triple Gate, did not exist at the time of the Temple. I believe this section to have been added to the Mount by Hadrian around 135 AD.

So even though it looks like the bridge runs up along side the temple mount in the picture in fact it went up the hill and connected to Triple gate, which was once Solomon's Portico. The approximate length of the bridge 2000 cubits, which is the distance required from the Holy of Holies to the Red Heifer Altar.
