We all need a battle to fight, a goal to attain.

When confronted with the majesty of God, you seek Him or you fight Him.

God Honors his Promises, all of them. The Word of God is sure.

The greatest encouragement of all. I am with you, I am for you. v 8

God sent fear, panic into the enemy's hearts. v 10

God sent hailstones to overcome the enemy. v 11

God heard the prayer of Joshua, v 14

God put down all opposition. v 21 (See 1 Cor 15:25)

Put feet on your enemy's necks. v 24-25 (See Rom 16:20)

What is the goal of our battle today?

Will it ever happen? v 29-43

Where do we see such victory today?

If you are in a battle against God, who is at fault for the battle?

We do not often think of God as a divine warrior.

We need a God who is strong to save, to defeat sin, to establish peace.

Where does your conception of God come from?

If evil exists, God doesn't! (3 bad assumptions)

There is evil in the world today due to sin, and God allows it; for now.

Canaanite Religion, a primer.

Why did Adoni-Zedek attack?

Why did Joshua come to the relief of Gibeon?

How did God assure them of victory? He repeated an old promise.

How did Joshua run in the way of God's commandments?

Who Fights the Battle? God does.

In this instance how do we see the power of prayer?

Why the Humiliation of the Kings? (Feet on their necks. See 1 Corinthians 15:25-27)

God keeps His promises. God (still) fights for His people.
