

1. Pluralism states that "all paths are equally valid."
2. Many today struggle to live a meaningful life in a pluralistic culture.
3. We are losing the answers to these four crucial questions:
 - A. Origin - where did I come from?
 - B. Meaning - Why am I here?
 - C. Morality - How should I live?
 - D. Destiny - Where am I headed?
4. For example: Pluralist argues that Islam and Christianity are both monotheistic religions and claim their spiritual descendance from Abraham - so the same God is worshiped by either.
5. But - we do not share the most essential understandings of God and revelations about God from the Scripture.
6. Believers of Biblical Christianity do not believe in three gods - nor do they believe in one person who acts in three different ways at different times.
7. We believe in the Trinity: one God who has always existed in three distinct persons.
8. Matthew 3:16-17; Matthew 28:19; John 1:1, 10:30, 14:10-12, 20:28; Acts 5:3-4; 2 Corinthians 3:17.
9. God is also love and righteous.
10. God is one yet when He reveals Himself in Scripture - we see His glory in many beautiful attributes.
11. God is love: Exodus 34:6 and 1 John 4:8.
12. God is righteous: Deuteronomy 32:4; Psalm 11:5-7, 33:5.
13. God is Lord. He is the great King. He has no beginning and no end. He is omnipresent, omniscient, and omnipotent.
14. God created all things visible and invisible. (Genesis 1:1)
15. God is Lord not only in spiritual things but also of the physical world. (Job 38)
16. Everything that we can see or that scientists can measure was made by God - so He is Lord of all. (Acts 17:24)
17. God also made what we cannot see - such as the angels. (Colossians 1:16)
18. Creation is the work of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. (Job 33:4; John 1:1-3; Hebrews 1:2)
19. God provides for and upholds it by His promises. (Hebrews 1:3)
