XXII. Spiritual Duty in a Hostile World

- A. Our Incentive vs 7a
 - 1. But the end
 - a. *telos* the point aimed at as a limit, the conclusion of an act or state (termination), result (immediate, ultimate or prophetic), purpose); end(-ing), finally, uttermost.
 - b. here refers to consummation, fulfillment, a purpose attained or goal achieved
 - 2. of all things in context refers to Christ's return Ac 3:2; Col 3:4; 2 Th 1:10; 2 Tim 4:1, 8; Heb 9:26; Rev 20:11-13
 - 3. is at hand
 - a. *eggizo* to make near, approach, be at hand, come (draw) near, be (come, draw) nigh.
 - b. perfect tense indicating an imminent event, it could occur at any time Mt 24:37-39; Ro 13:12; 1 Th 5:2; Rev 16:15; 22:20
 - c. Peter already indicated this was an expectancy that should be at the forefront of a believer's thinking salvation ready to be revealed in the last time 1:5 d. numerous other passages also exhort the believer to live in anticipation of the Lord's return Mk 13:35-37; Lk 12:40; 21:36; 1 Co 1:7; 1 Tim 6:14; Tit 2:13; Jas 5:7-9
 - 4. Living in anticipation of change is not new
 - a. The Jews lived under the Old Covenant looking forward to a promised New Covenant
 - i. when Christ came preaching the kingdom of God was at hand they were not ready and rejected
 - ii. In 70 A.D., God put and end of any hope in the Old by having Rome destroy the Temple
 - b. Paul speaks to the suddenness of the coming change in God's program
 - i. 1 Co 15:51-53
 - ii. 1 Th 4:15-17
 - c. The Author of Heb exhorts 10:25b so much the more as you see the Day approaching.
 - 5. What living in anticipation of His return looks like
 - a. John also exhorted active participation in sanctification 1 Jo 3:1-3
 - b. know that His return brings judgment on unbelievers, Paul exhorted evangelism 2 Co 5:11 Knowing, ..., the terror of the Lord, we persuade men
 - 6. the 1st century Church was already in the last days, how much more so, us
 - a. 1st century initiated by the Lord's coming Heb 1:1-2; 1 Jo 2:18,
 - b. we are closer falling away 2Th 2:3; 1Ti 4:1; perilous times 2Ti 3:1
 - 7. Christ's comings
 - a. 1st coming provided salvation Col 1:13-14
 - b. 2nd coming He will establish the promised kingdom Is 65:17-25; Ez 37:24-25; Hos 3:5; Zech 14:16-21; Rev 20:1-6
- 8. a reward for those that look for His return 2 Tim 4:8 crown of righteousness B. Our Instruction vs 7b-11a
 - 1. section filled with commands indicating the need to count the cost to follow Jesus
 - 2. Personal Holiness vs 7b

- a. therefore be serious
 - i. sophroneo to be of sound mind, sane, moderate, be in right mind.
 - ii. Be under control and not carried away by an errant view of oneself Ro
 - 12:3 or undue emotion or uncontrolled passion Pro 4:23
 - iii. The world is constantly trying to distract, deflect, or destroy us through the appeal to self indulgence, we must keep an eternal perspective Lu 21:34; Ro 13:12;
- b. and watchful
 - i. *nepho* to abstain from wine (keep sober), be discreet:--be sober, watch.
 - ii. Closely related to serious
 - iii. Denotes being spiritually observant, alert Mt 26:41; 1Pe 1:13; 5:8;
- c. in your prayers Php 4:5
 - i. access to spiritual resources
 - ii. Holy living comes as we read and meditate on God's word regularly, learning how God thinks as we commune with Him and looking to Him for all that we need to live here according to what He has promised.
- 2. Mutual Love vs 8-9
 - a. above all things Col 3:14
 - i. speaks to the supreme importance of the following statement
 - ii. this would include the above virtues
 - b. have fervent love for one another,
 - i. ektenes intent:--without ceasing, fervent. -
 - ii. Denotes stretching or straining like an athlete exerting maximum effort
 - iii. *agape* also carries strong volitional significance, it is a decision to love those who are at times unlovable
 - hangs the whole Law and Prophets Mt 22:40
 - By this all will know that you are My disciples Jo 13:35
 - c. how love is shown
 - i. for "love will cover a multitude of sins." Pr 10:12; 1Co 13:7;
 - our own forgiveness is dependent on this Mt 6:15
 - even as Christ forgave you, so you also must do Col 3:13
 - ii. Be hospitable Ro 12:13; Phm 1:14; Heb 13:2
 - to one another the idea is strangers, outside of Christians
 - without grumbling part of being hospitable 2Co 9:7; Php 2:14;
- 3. Spiritual Service vs 10-11a
 - a. As each one has received a gift,
 - b. minister it to one another, Ro 12:6;
 - i. as good stewards 1Co 4:1-2,
 - ii. of the manifold grace of God. 1Co 3:10;
 - poikilos motley, i.e. various in character:--divers, manifold.
 - as God has dealt to each one a measure of faith Ro 12:3
 - according to the grace that is given to us, let us use them Ro 12:6
 - c. If anyone Ro 12:6-8
 - i. speaks, let him speak as the oracles of God.
 - ii. ministers, let him do it as with the ability which God supplies,
- C. Our Intention vs 11b; 1Pe 2:5
 - 1. that in all things God may be glorified the goal of every New Man
 - 2. through Jesus Christ, only accomplished as one abides in Christ Jo 15:5
 - a. to whom belong the glory and the dominion
 - b. forever and ever. Amen. a doxology as his closing remarks Re 1:6
