INTRODUCTION

The cycles of life are <u>opportunities</u> we have to either accomplish our own earthly purposes or God's eternal purposes.

Psalm 90:12

[12] So teach us to number our days that we may get a heart of wisdom.

THE ENDLESS CYCLE OF NATURE

We shouldn't pridefully overestimate how much value we bring to the table.

Romans 12:3–[3] For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think, but to think with sober judgment, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned.

The cycles of our lives are <u>insignificant</u> in comparison to the cycles of nature.

Why does creation seem to have greater perseverance in fulfilling its purpose than man?

Sin brought about a curse to the created <u>order</u> and it deeply affects man's ability to live with purpose.

Genesis 1:28–[28] And God blessed them. And God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth and subdue it..."

Romans 8:20–21–[20] For the creation was subjected to futility, not willingly, but because of him who subjected it, in hope [21] that the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to corruption and obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God.

Jesus is redeeming his creation, and this redemption will only be <u>complete</u> once all the children of God turn to him in faith and repentance.

Creation was made to <u>serve</u> man, and not man creation.

The cycles of creation are an evidence of God's grace towards us.
