Application Questions

These questions are provided for your further study and application of today's sermon. Thoughtfully writing out the answers to these questions will help to drive home the point of today's study. It is also helpful when you are able to discuss your answers with others.

- 1. Read **Luke 14:27-30**. Why is this self-assessment of our willingness to follow Christ anywhere important to consider even if you currently sense that God has obviously established you in your present locale?
- 2. Read **Psalm 23**. Why is contentment in our relationship with God so important when considering that the Lord may lead you at some point away from what you consider to be green pastures?
- 3. Read **Mark 5:18-20**. How is the challenge different (and sometimes even more difficult) for those who are called to "stay" versus those who are called to go to some other geographic location?
- 4. Read **Jonah 4**. What are some of the subtle symptoms of ethnocentricity, xenophobia, and national prejudice? Why is this such an offense to God?
- 5. Read **1 John 2:17**. Write out a prayer to God that expresses your willingness to go and do whatever it is that Christ may desire of you.
