- 1. We are always communicating use of a single word. In uses Dan's vocab in Rv 1:19 Dan's latter days = Jn's soon, quickly, near: now! Not yet too.
- 2. The way Jn says what he says is important too how it is said.

1st: Who Are You Talking To?

- 1. The proper recipients of Revelation: Jesus' fiancé/bride: 1:1; v3; <u>v4</u>; v6; v9; <u>v11</u>; 19-20 Rv is written to you: the church never forget that.
 - i. Eph 5:25b-27 atonement & eschatology v31-32
- 2. We are churchmen Jesus' Bride recipients of Jesus' letters.

2nd: Why Did You Say It Like That?

- 1. 1st of 7 cycles concludes at end of chpt 3.
 - i. Cycle: 1st coming [1:5] & 2nd coming [1:7]. Each letter promises smthg to be given in glory. 3:20-21 *will dine* cld => marriage supper 19:7-9
 - ii. This cycle focuses on the church until Jesus returns: pressures from outside [persecution] & from inside [compromise] -> apostasy
- 2. Arranged mail route, also a "chiasm" [a,b,c,d,c^1,b^1,a^1] outside & center Thyathra

Pergamum Symrna Sardis Philadelphia

Laodicea Ephesus

- 3. 3 categories: 1] critical condition; 2] compromised; 3] facing persecution; arranged in parallel: critical, persecution, compromise Thyatira at center.
- 4. All churches are addressed by each church & all the churches combined
 - i. 2:23 center of chaism: all the churches will know
 - ii. He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches
 - iii. 22:16 Rv is written to the churches.
- 5. Sober over-all assessment. Not historicist [each church = period of history], but lessons learned from over-all structure of a "cycle" that recapitulates while making linear progress to the end. Lk 18:8; Rv 11; 19-20. Time preceding Jesus' return is dire & dangerous.
- 6. Realism of warfare: constant summons *repent!* Eph 2:5; Perg 2:16; Thya 2:22; Sardis 3:3; Lao 3:19. Worship; truth; love; life; light witness.

3rd: Would You Repeat That Please?

- 1. The letters connect to Jesus in chpt 1 & glory in chpt 21-22. The entirety of Rv speaks to the churches.
- 2. Each letter is structured the same: prophetic messages: 7-part template
 - i. The Address: To the angel of the church in ...write
 - ii. The Identification of the Author: the One who... says this.
 - iii. Evaluation of the condition of the church: I know (your deeds)...
 - iv. Praise or Reproof
 - v. Exhortation
 - vi. Command to Hear what Spirit says: he who has an ear...

- vii. Promises to Overcomer: he who overcomes... (#6 & 7 switch in last 3)
- 3. Each letter concerns same things: quality of the light emitted by lampstand
 - i. Fidelity to Jesus is the central concern. Jesus knows the deeds of each church & assesses according to facts: calls to persevere in faithfulness.
 - ii. hear what Spirit says = content of written letters
 - iii. Each letter calls each disciple to be an overcomer = he [individual] who has an ear & hears what HS says to churches [community].
 - iv. Each letter climaxes w/ prospect of our inheritance Rv 21:7

Applic #1: Biblical Christianity is Expressed & Experienced as Churchmen

- 1. I'm grateful for your churchmanship but unsettled by pervasive shoddy churchmanship among professing Xns: dangerous.
- 2. Which is more important: the one or the many? Zeitgeist teeters back & forth: rugged ind'ism vs identity politics. Church men strive for balance *you* [plural] *are Christ's body & individually members of it* [1C 12:27], Wm Merill 1911 "Rise up O Men of God" [tune #502]
