## III. What are we called to consider?

- A. Consider defined
  - 1. Consider Him as *The Apostle* or *Messenger of God*: what is His message? a. The message of unconditional – free – sovereign love (John 3:16-17)

b. The answer on the question: How to be just with God? Job 9:2

2. Consider Him as the *High Priest*a. in laying down His life to make reconciliation (Heb. 2:17)

b. in His sublime character: *merciful – faithful – understanding* 

- I am meek and lowly of heart (Matt. 11:29)
- c. in bringing 'rest' (Heb. 4:1-11; Matt. 11:28-29)
  - the rest of *His satisfaction for all my debts to God* (Heb. 2:17)
  - the rest of *His ability to save to the uttermost* (Heb. 7:25)
- 3. Consider Him as *the faithful to His Father's charge* ( a. Doubt not that He is *the same yesterday, today and forever* (Heb. 13:8)

His Call to all He is not ashamed to call His brethren: And Boaz said under her, At meal time come thou hither, and eat of the bread, and dip thy morsel in the vinegar. (Ruth 2:14a)
