Leviticus 19.33-37 True Equity and Beyond (Or the Sin of “If You Ain’t Dutch, You Ain’t Much”)

Heidelberg Catechism Lord’s Day 42

Theme: Godliness demands true equity and beyond

1. The common context will always be Tribalism

2. Don’t steal...or swindle...for that is stealing, too

3. All methods of setting value must declare truth

4. Obeying the Lord will enable us to help our neighbor
