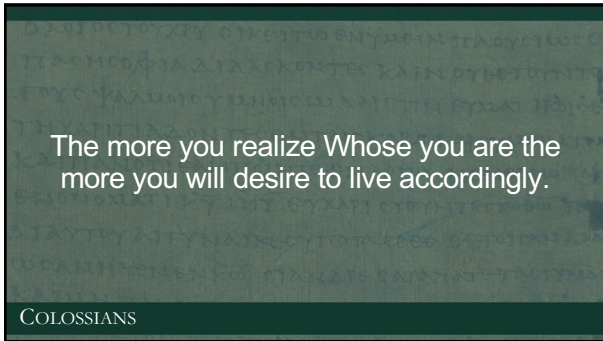
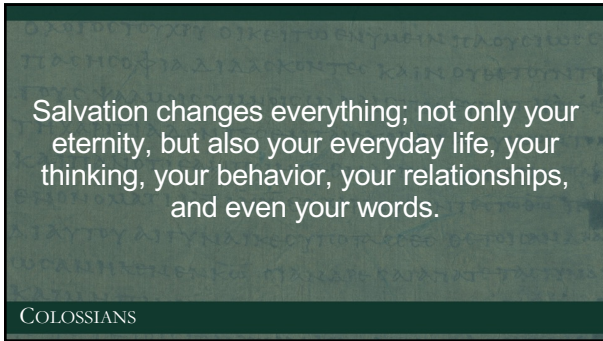

- 1. Read Luke 10:25-37 about the Good Samaritan. What lesson was Christ teaching?**

- 2. Read Romans 12:9-13. In this passage, Paul writes similarly to the Romans as he did to the Colossians in 3:12-17. What similarities can you spot?**

- 3. Read over the list in Col. 3:12-17. What if you had a group of people who truly tried to live like Paul prescribes? Do you think that would be an amazing group of people to do life with? _____ This is exactly what we are to have in the local church. Why do you think that this type of unity is difficult to achieve. Think of a few problems and how to solve them.**

- 4. In light of Col. 3:12-17 how would you advise a Christian who was offended by another church member?**

- 5. Many churches have separate worship services with different styles of worship music. Do you think this is a good idea? Why or why not.**

- 6. Read Colossians 3:16. Who is called upon to teach and admonish?**

_____ This passage teaches that it was commonplace for the church to be engaged in teaching and admonishing one another. Why do think it is that this type of ministry has diminished or even been lost in many churches?

What can we do to be better at teaching and admonishing each other on a regular basis?
