 - -Jesus is the bread from heaven that gives life (vs. 33, 38, 51, 58).
 - -Jesus' heavenly origin is a regular theme in John's gospel (1:1; 3:13, 31).
 - -Familiarity breeds contempt (vs. 41, 42). See Mark 6:1-4; John 4:43, 44.
 - -Jesus knows of the total inability of His hearers to embrace His message apart from divine assistance (v. 44; Rom. 8:7). v. 44: draw = drag (John 18:10; 21:6, 11; Acts 16:19; 21:30; James 2:6)
 - -Jesus quotes from Is. 54:13 in v. 45. In the NT, the gathering of NC community is the typological fulfillment of the restoration of Jerusalem after the Babylonian exile.
 - -v. 46: No one can know the Father apart from the revelation of Him in Jesus Christ because He alone has seen the Father.

Practical Lessons

- 1) Our ideas about Jesus of Nazareth must come from the Bible.
- 2) Our grumbling against others is really grumbling against God.
- 3) People are incapable of coming to Christ apart from divine enablement.
