

4. Description of Deliverance	v. 7c "But then you brought up my life from the pit."
5. Vows	vv. 10a - b "As for me, with a thankful voice, I will sacrifice to you; that which I vowed, I will pay."
6. Praise	v. 10c "Salvation belongs to YHWH!"
