## Psalm 85 O God Our Help

**Introduction**: From book 3 of the Psalms, focusing on The End of the Historical Davidic House. It answers the question, Is God's covenant with David abandoned?

God is referred to as "helper/help" (nearly 12 x) in Exod. 18:4; Deut. 33:7, 29; Ps. 10:14; 27:9; 30:10; 54:4; 70:5; 121:2; 124:8; and 146:5. Women reflect this aspect of God's image in Gen. 2:18, 20.

If one looks and listens carefully, one can hear echoes of Exod. 34:6-7. Note also the 5 uses of turn/return: 85:1, 3, 4, 6, 8

Superscription: For the choir director. Of the sons of Korah. A Psalm.

## 1) THE PAST: restoration from Exile (second and third person)-85:1-3

- Six perfect verbs emphasizing God's completed actions toward Israel
- a) God's pleasure—85:1 <sup>1</sup> O Yahweh, You showed favor [Qal pf. <u>ratsah</u>] (emphatic) to Your land; You returned [Qal pf. <u>shub</u>] the fortunes [<u>shebuth</u>] of Jacob.
  - i) It is His land to give to whomever He pleases. He has given it to Israel. However, cf. 85:9, 12.
  - ii) "Returned the fortunes" is a technical phrase for the restoration of the oppressed and harassed people from Exile. (Willem VanGemeren) (cf. Ps. 14:7; 53:6; 126:1; Jer. 29:14)
- b) **God's forgiveness**—85:2 <sup>2</sup> You forgave [Qal pf.] the iniquity of Your people; You covered [Piel pf.] all their sin. Selah.
  - i) Cf. Jer. 25:1-11
  - ii) God answered Daniel's prayers. (Dan. 9:19)
- c) God's anger—85:3 <sup>3</sup> You withdrew [Qal pf.] all Your fury; You turned back [Hiphil pf. <u>shub]</u> from Your burning anger.
  - i) Cf. 2 Kings 17:18; 2 Chron. 36:16-21; Isa. 40:2

## 2) THE PRESENT: be loyal to us (first person)-85:4-7

- Can the experience of forgiveness be repeated now? Is the situation so bad that God will abandon His covenant?
- They are back where they once were, in need of forgiveness.
- a) **Two requests**—85:4
  - i) <sup>4</sup> <u>Turn us back</u> [Qal impv. <u>shub]</u>, O God of our salvation,
  - ii) And <u>cause</u> Your vexation toward us <u>to cease</u>.

- iii) As Charles Spurgeon said, It is not that God needs turning from his anger so much as that we need turning from our sin; here is the hinge of the whole matter.
- b) Three legitimate, yet rhetorical, questions—85:5-6
  - i) <sup>5</sup> Will You be angry with us forever?
  - ii) Will You prolong Your anger from generation to generation?
  - iii)<sup>6</sup> Will You (emphatic) not Yourself return [Qal impf. <u>shub</u>] to revive us, That Your people may be glad in You?
- c) Two requests-85:7
  - i) <sup>7</sup> <u>Show us</u> (lit. "cause us to see"), O Yahweh, Your lovingkindness [<u>chesed</u>],
  - ii) And give us Your salvation.
- 3) THE FUTURE: trust in His revealed truth (first, second, and third person)—85:8-13
  - Ultimate fulfillment of this will be in the Millennial Kingdom of Jesus Christ. (Peter Steveson)
  - a) The desire for God's Word—85:8
    - i) <sup>8</sup> Let me hear what the God, Yahweh, will speak;
    - ii) For He will speak peace [<u>shalom</u>] (wholeness) to His people, to His holy ones;
    - iii) But let them not turn back [Qal impf. <u>shub]</u> to folly.
  - b) The sufficiency of God's Word-85:9
    - i) <sup>9</sup> Surely His salvation is near to those who fear Him,
    - ii) Why? *That* (the Shekinah?) glory may dwell [shakan] in our land (cf. 85:1, 12).
      - (1) The glory cloud gradually (reluctantly) departed in Ezek. 8-11 in @ 586 BC.
        - (a) From the front door (9:3; 10:4) to the East gate by the outer wall (10:18-19) to the Mount of Olives (11:22-23)
      - (2) The glory (in the person of Jesus Christ) is promised to return during the Millennial Kingdom. (Ezek. 43:1-7; 44:4)
        - (a) This helps us establish a date for this psalm, after the prophecy was recorded in Ezekiel.
  - c) The demonstration of God's Word—85:10-11
    - Heaven and earth are in harmony, no longer in opposition.
    - i) God and people: <sup>10</sup> Lovingkindness [<u>chesed</u>] and truth [<u>emeth</u>] have met together; Righteousness [<u>tsedeq</u>] and peace [<u>shalom</u>] have kissed each other.
    - ii) From the saved people: <sup>11</sup> Truth [emeth] springs up from the earth,
    - iii) From God: And righteousness [tsedeq] looks down from heaven.

- d) The fulfillment of God's Word—85:12-13
  - i) Fertility: <sup>12</sup> Indeed, Yahweh will give what is good [tob], And our land (cf. 85:1, 9) will yield its produce.
  - ii) Salvation: <sup>13</sup> Righteousness [tsedeq] will go before Him And will establish the way of His steps.

## 4) Things we need to remember:

- a) **Rejoice that God's purpose** for Israel will be completed at just the right time.
- b) **Rejoice that God's glory** in the person of Jesus Christ will one day rule from His rightful throne in Jerusalem so that these attributes of God will be manifested on this earth.
- c) **Remember God's self-revelation** of His character and what our response should be: "Yahweh, Yahweh God, compassionate and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in lovingkindness and truth; <sup>7</sup> who keeps lovingkindness for thousands, who forgives iniquity, transgression, and sin; yet He will by no means leave the guilty unpunished, visiting the iniquity of fathers on the children and on the grandchildren to the third and fourth generations." <sup>8</sup> And Moses made haste to bow low toward the earth and worship. (Exod. 34:6-8)
