O P of God

6 P of the Messiah

- Types of Christ, found on the Old Testament
- 1. **Abel** was the first one to suffer for righteousness sake (Matt. 23:34-35).
- 2. **Isaac** was the promised "son of Abraham." The promises of God were given directly to Abraham with respect to His son (offspring). Everywhere in the New Testament are we taught that Jesus is the true promised son of Abraham. However, in the original giving of the promise **Isaac** was the promised son in view. The birth and life of Isaac also typify the Redeemer. Just as Isaac's birth was the result of the supernatural power of God so too was it true of Jesus.

Isaac typified the Redeemer in that he is the only other human sacrifice that God commanded, and even though God stopped Abraham from going through with the sacrifice of Isaac—he is said to have died and been risen "figuratively" (Hebrews 11:19).
