Intro: To magnify God is the most blessed employment!

A. God promised to magnify Himself in judgment: Ezek. 38:23 (Num 14:11)

- B. Yet God's greatest magnification is not in His judgments of sinners
 - 1. Consider Numbers 14:17 Ps. 8:4 John 8:28
- C. To the upright, nothing is more desired than to magnify the LORD: Ps. 34:1-3

MARY'S MAGNIFICAT

I. The occasion II. The themes

I. The Occasion of her Mary's Magnificat

- A. The indirect occasion of her song was angel's revelation (vs. 26-38)
 - 1. Gabriel's revelation was confirmed with a 'sign' in her cousin (vs. 36-37)
 - 2. Observe Mary's unparalleled confession of faith: vs. 38
 - a. Would her faith be tried? Did she need confirmation?
 - b. What could causes for doubts and fears in young believers?
- B. The immediate occasion was Elizabeth's words (41-45)
 - 1. God always confirms His work through His Word through Spirit (41b)
- C. Mary's magnification of the Lord shows her spiritual progress

II. The four main themes of her Magnificat

- A. God is a personal Savior of sinners (vs. 47b)
 - 1. Mary was as much a child of Adam as we all are:
 - 2. She needed her Son to do for her what we all need: 1 John 3:8b
 - 3. Let Mary's theme encourage you to storm His throne of grace today

- B. God is a gracious & merciful Savior (vs. 48, 50, 54)
 - 1. Never did Mary expect this favor to be hers (vs. 29)
 - 2. This theme of her song is God's message to you
 - a. look away from yourself
 - b. cast yourself on the God Who came to seek and save sinners
- C. God is a *mighty Savior* (vs. 49; 51-52)
 - 1. Mary exalted the Lord's might as *holy* (vs. 49)
 - a. holiness is not only *sinless perfection* it is God's *infinite loveliness*
 - 2. He is the kind of Savior you need (51-52)
- D. God is a faithful Savior (54-55)
 - 1. No creature has been so unfaithful than mankind: Jer. 2:9-13
 - 2. Yet over against the incriminating record shines God's astounding truth a. And we beheld His glory, full of grace and truth (John 1:14b)
 - b. He came unto his own, and his own received Him not (John 1:11)
 - c. Scripture celebrates God's faithfulness: Ps. 36:5; 89:8; Is. 11:5
 - 3. Now finally, God fulfilled His ancient promises (Is. 7:14; Gal 4:4)

It is not quite as bad to say there is no God, than to say that God is unfaithful (Thomas Brooks)
