<p>Daily Readings: Day 1: 1-5 Day 2: 6-10 Day 3: 11-15 Day 4: 16-20 Day 5: 21-25 Day 6: 26-29 Day 7: 30-33</p> <hr/> <p style="text-align: center;">INTRO, ISAIAH</p> <p>A mini-Bible. 39 chapters of judgment followed by 27 chapters of hope! <i>Yasha'yahu, Yeshaiiah</i> = "Yahweh is salvation". A good theme for the book. Isaiah called the "Paul" of the Old Testament. (Well-educated, uncompromising, sincere, compassionate). His wife a prophetess. Tradition: sawn in two during reign of Manasseh.</p> <p>Ministered from about 740-680. (see 1:1) Assyria grows strong, takes Israel and much of Judah. Like Micah, he warns Judah not of Assyria, but Babylonia, though Babylon not risen to power. Ministered to Hezekiah, but perhaps killed by Hezekiah's son, who overthrew Yahweh worship.</p> <p>CHRIST: Everywhere in this book! Isaiah sounds more like a New Testament writer! Here is a list of some of the Christ passages already fulfilled: 7:14, 9:1,2,6, 11:1,2 28:16 40:3-5 42:1-4,6 50:6 52:14 53,all 61:1,2.
