THE PROMISE BELIEVED - JOSEPH Matthew 1:18-25; 2:13-23

The root of all promises:

- The foul <u>hurt</u> of our problem: When God said, "don't", they did; so we are paying the price. (Romans 5:12)
- 2. The first <u>hint</u> of the promise: When God saw what they did, then here's what He did. (Genesis 3:15)
- He pronounced Satan's **defeat**
- He promised mankind's **deliverance**

Life lessons from the Silent Character in the Christmas Story

- You can trust God's promise in <u>moments of doubt</u>.
 (1:18-25)
 - a) He doubted that what he was hearing **could be true.** (1:18)
 - b) He doubted he could withstand the **gossipy** talk.
 - c) He doubted that his fiancé was worthy of <u>trust.</u> (1:19)
 - d) He decided to trust God <u>in spite of his doubts.</u> (1:20-25)

- You can trust God's promise in the middle of <u>danger</u>.
 (2:13-15) If you can't trust God in <u>doubt</u> you will never trust Him in <u>danger</u>.
 - a) His trust was demonstrated by <u>ordinary obedience</u>. (2:14)
 - b) His trust was rewarded by **extraordinary guidance**. (2:19-23)
 - c) He trusted God in spite of the **danger**. (2:14-15)
- 3) You can trust God's promise in the midst of great <u>difficulty</u>. (2:19-23)
 - a) The path of <u>least resistance</u> may not be God's plan.
 - b) The path of **human reason** may not be God's plan.
 - c) The path of **social conformity** may not be God's plan.
 - d) He trusted God in spite of the **difficulty**.

Carry this with you:

- For every problem there is a <u>provision</u> and that <u>provision</u> is in accordance with a <u>promise</u>.
- Joseph's security and salvation depended on believing God's promise.
- 1 John 2:25 Have you believed the promise?
