3 <a> Rugged Individualism

- · Far too many Christians today have a "maverick" mindset
- · View themselves as rugged individuals
- · "Am I my brother's keeper?" [Gen. 4:9]
- · "I am the captain of my fate; I am the master of my soul"
- "The philosophy that we are basically self-sufficient and do not need anyone else is Satan's philosophy and the opposite of God's plan and will for men." John MacArthur

 - "Caught up into the third heaven," and there he was given "an abundance of revelations."

- 9 <a>Spirituality
 - "Now concerning spiritual things" [Verse 1a] "pneumatika
 - · "... brothers, I do not want you to be ignorant." [v. 1b]
 - "You know that when you were pagans, somehow or other you were influenced and led astray to mute idols. Therefore I tell you that no one who is speaking by the Spirit of God says, "Jesus be cursed," and no one can say, "Jesus is Lord," except by the Holy Spirit."" [vv. 2-3]
- 10 <a> Two important truths
 - 1) The natural man "...led astray to mute ['dumb'] idols!"
 - ✓ [II Cor. 4:4; Rom. 8:7b; Rom. 3:11b; Jn. 6:44]
 - 2) The Spirit filled Christian is defined primarily in terms of his subjection to the Sovereign Lordship of Christ and his yieldedness to the Spirit of Christ within!
 - ✓ I Cor. 12:3b "... no one can say 'Jesus is Lord,' except by the Spirit."
- 11 Diversity
 - The Trinity of the Godhead: the perfect example of unity in diversity and diversity in unity!
 - "There are different kinds of gifts, but the same <u>Spirit</u>. There are different kinds of service, but the same <u>Lord</u>.
 There are different kinds of working, but the same <u>God</u> works all of them in all men." verses 4-6
 - "Now to each one the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good." V.7
 - "The body is a unit, though it is made up of many parts; and though all its parts are many, they form one body.

12 **Unity**

- Verse13 "For we were all baptized by one Spirit into one body—whether Jews or Greeks, slave or free—and we were all given the one Spirit to drink."
- Eph. 4:3 "Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace."
- John 17:21 "-... that all of them may be one, Father, just as you are in me and I am in you. May
 they also be in us so that the world may believe that you have sent me."
- 13 Three necessary prerequisites for such unity
 - vv. 14-20 We must all possess an attitude of humble acceptance of our divinely appointed role in the body, - i.e. not be envious!
 - We must have an appreciation of what others are doing! [We need each other! We can't afford to be exclusive - "This is what it's all about! We don't need that!"]
 - vv. 23-24 There must be an affirmation of the less spectacular and conspicuous gifts, which often do not get much recognition!

14 <a>Mutuality

• The true 'unity' produced by the Holy Spirit will lead to "mutuality;" [i.e. a conscious sense of interdependence upon each other for the carrying out of Christ's purpose in the church and a calm cooperation with each other!]

15 Ministry

 Foundational to the success of the church is the realization that the Holy Spirit gives gifts as "tools" for ministry! [i.e. the spiritual gifts are not merely for personal enjoyment and gratification, but for productive and fruitful work in the various ministries of the church! - cf. Eph. 2:10!
