Call to Confession -

The proof of God's amazing love is this: While we were sinners Christ died for us. Because we have faith in him, we dare to approach God with confidence. In faith and penitent hearts, let us confess our sin before God and one another.

Rom. 5:8; Heb. 4:16

We give thanks to you, Redeemer God, for our Lord Jesus Christ, who came in quietness and humility, but will come again with power for all to see. Our Lord Jesus' coming again is a two-edged sword. It comforts us, and it convinces us anew that your grace is beyond measure. Yet it also confronts us and compels us to recognize our own unrighteousness. Enable us to put aside our false pride, confess our sins, and receive your loving pardon.

Confession of Sin –

Gracious Lord, you alone are righteous and holy, and in your presence no one can stand. Your gracious mercy is our only hope and we come to ask for your forgiveness.

Catechism Questions on Advent

Q. How does Christ's resurrection benefit us?

Third, Christ's resurrection is a sure pledge to us of our blessed resurrection

Q. How does "the resurrection of the body" comfort you?

A. Not only will my soul be taken immediately after this life to Christ its head, but also my very flesh will be raised by the power of Christ, reunited with my soul, and made like Christ's glorious body.

Q. How does Christ's return "to judge the living and the dead" comfort you?

A. In all distress and persecution, with uplifted head, I confidently await the very judge who has already offered himself to the judgment of God in my place and removed the whole curse from me. Christ will cast all his enemies and mine into everlasting condemnation, but will take me and all his chosen ones to himself into the joy and glory of heaven.

An Advent Confession

We believe in the name of the only-begotten Son of God, by Whom all things were made, and by Whom we were created.

We believe that He was made flesh and lived among us.

The Holy Spirit overshadowed the virgin Mary causing her to conceive a child. Just as Christ's people partake of flesh and blood, so did he do the same. He was born of a woman, and he took the nature of a servant.

Since he was fully a human, he was subject to every kind of temptation as we are, yet he did not sin.

This we surely believe.

Jesus is the Lord, the Messenger of the covenant, and in him we delight. He spoke that which he knew to be true, and testified to what he had seen.

As many people as received Him, to them He gave power to become the children of God.

"Let not your heart be troubled: believe in God, believe also in Me. In My Father's house there are many mansions. If it were not so I would have told you; for I go to prepare a place for you. And if I go to prepare a place for you, I will come again, and receive you to Myself, so that where I am, you may also be with me."

Even so, come Lord Jesus!

The Lord will descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of the archangel, and with the trumpet of God. He will judge both the living and the dead. For the hour is coming, in which all who are in the graves shall hear the voice and shall come forth to judgment. Then Christ will sit on the throne of his glory, and all the holy angels will be with him, and all the nations will be gathered before Him.

But who may endure the day of his coming? And who will be able to stand when he appears?

Holy, holy, holy is the Lord God Almighty, Who was, and is, and is to come.

Behold, the Lord God will come with a strong hand, and his arm shall rule for Him; behold, His reward is with Him, and He will complete all his work.

And when all things are subjected to Him, then God will be all in all.

By Your atoning death for our sins, by Your burial in the grave, by Your triumphant resurrection and ascension, by Your sitting at the right hand of God, by your sending the Holy Spirit, by Your all-conquering intercession, by Your holy sacraments, by Your divine presence, by Your coming again to Your Church on earth or by our being called home to You,

Bless and comfort us, gracious Lord and God.

The Institution

1 Cor. 11:23-26

The night in which he gave himself up for us, the Lord Jesus took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body, which is for you; do this in remembrance of me."

In the same way, after supper he took the cup, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood; do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me."

The Apostle Paul tells us that whenever we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

Father, in remembrance of your mighty acts in Jesus Christ, we offer ourselves in praise and thanksgiving as a holy and living sacrifice because of Christ's sacrifice for us, and we proclaim the mystery and glory of our faith:

Christ has died; Christ has risen; Christ will come again.

Father, pour out your Holy Spirit on us gathered here.

We give you thanks for this bread and cup and dedicate them to sacred use.

Let this bread and wine be to us the body and the blood of Christ, that we may partake spiritually of Christ's body and blood, that we may eat and drink of him whom to know is life eternal.

By your Spirit evermore unite us to Christ our Lord, unite us to one another, and make us one in ministry to the world, until Christ comes in final victory and we feast at his heavenly banquet.

Through your Son Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is yours, gracious Father, now and forever.

Amen!
