Philippians 4:21-23 — "Final Words of Pastoral Encouragements to a Faithful Church!" Introduction:

- Paul's concluding words follow generally the same format as ancient letter-writing patterns but they show the distinctive WARMTH and GLORY of Christian love.
 - ✓ Paul calls believers to be actively involved in greeting one another with Christian warmth, tenderness, love and intentionality.
 - ✓ Paul encourages believers in sharing how the gospel has impacted the very heart of Caesar's empire.
 - ✓ Paul reminds them of the wondrous grace that comes from God our Savior, Jesus Christ.

O to think of how God might grow & strengthen us at CFBC as we learn from Paul (1) to greet. every single believer with warmth, intentionality and affection, (2) to speak of how the gospel is working in us & thru us, and (3) to remind each other of God's grace that saved us & sustains us & carries us all the way to glory!

THESIS — In these final words to a faithful church, we'll see <u>2 Warm Pastoral Encouragements</u> *<u>so that</u>* we can love one another & honor our Savior & be a faithful local church.

I.GREET EVERY SAINT! (21-22)

Every true Christian is a "saint" - a 'holy one'

Every saint —	
In Christ lesus —	

The imperative: **Greet!** —

So how do you greet every saint? Some practical thoughts:

Some may be different, at a different stage of life or age, some may be critical of you, some may be immature believers, and in need of much growth, but as believers in Christ they are SAINTS and worthy of your deep warmth and tender affection and sincere love!

Those of "Caesar's household" —

Tertullian said that the Roman Emperor Nero was the first of Christianity's major persecutors.

Even the imperial power of Caesar cannot stop the power of the gospel!

IN CHRIST there is no East or West, In him no North or South, But one great fellowship of Love, Throughout the whole, wide Earth! — John Oxenham.

II.REMEMBER GOD'S GRACE! (23)

It's as if Paul reaches out with his words to embrace EACH MEMBER of the church and to ASSURE them that the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ is WITH THEM!

The grace comes **from** the Lord Jesus Christ:

We receive grace FROM God: for SUPPORT (Col 4.18), to STRENGTHEN (Heb 13.9), to SERVE (Eph 4.7), to BIND TOGETHER (believers) (Rev 22.21), at the THRONE (Heb 4.16), in ABUNDANCE (I Pet 1.2; 2 Pet 1.2), in CHRIST (Rev 1.4).

- 2. Jesus is our **SAVIOR** (1.29)
- 3. Jesus is our **MODEL** (2.1-5)

- 6. Jesus is our **HOPE** (3.20-21)

Marvelous Grace of our Loving Lord

Marvelous grace of our loving Lord, grace that exceeds our sin and our guilt, yonder on Calvary's mount out-poured, there where the blood of the Lamb was spilt.

Grace, grace, God's grace, grace that will pardon and cleanse within; grace, grace, God's grace, grace that is greater than all our sin. Dark is the stain that we cannot hide, what can avail to wash it away! Look! there is flowing a crimson tide; whiter than snow you may be today.

Marvelous, infinite, matchless grace, freely bestowed on all who believe; you that are longing to see his face, will you this moment his grace receive?
