Rom. 8:16-17, 23, 29-30; 1 Cor. 15:12-58
 - B. Believers will receive resurrected, glorified bodies like Christ's
Phil. 3:21; 1 Jn. 3:2
 - C. The Resurrection will be a general resurrection, which will be of both the righteous and the wicked, on the last day (the end of this age)
Jn. 5:28-29; 6:39-40; 11:23-24; Acts 24:15; Matt. 25:31-46; Rev. 20:11-15
 - D. Our judgment on the last day will be the ultimate vindication and application of Christ's work on our behalf as we are delivered from the second death.
