# 1 Peter 4:1, Arm yourselves with the mind of Christ, Part 1 GCC, 12/16/18, Morning Worship

#### Introduction

- A. Have you ever suffered for Christ's sake?
- B. The Culture is becoming increasingly hostile toward genuine Christians
- C. High School French Teacher Terminated for not using appropriate pronouns for transgender student (Rom 14:21–23). Pay homage to my identity!
- D. First Century Christians faced a similar challenge. Pay homage to Caesar!
- E. Both examples have similarities:
  - 1. The Christian is ordered to declare something to be so that they, in their hearts and minds, do not believe to be so.
  - 2. Political correctness, as defined by the State, makes this demand upon their consciences. It is of the essence of religion to require people to affirm as true what they cannot see.
- F. 1 Peter 3:17, "For it is better to suffer for *doing good*, if that should be God's will, than for doing evil."
- G. We need a weapon to endure suffering

<u>Main Idea:</u> The mindset of Christ will prepare us for and carry us through our suffering for Christ

# 1. The Weapon Against Suffering in the Christian Life (4:1)

- A. Arm yourselves
- B. With the same way of thinking—the intention of Christ to follow the will of the Father (1 Peter 3:17–18; 4:2)

## 2. The Centrality of the Cross in the Christian life (4:1)

- A. The Cross is central in the life of the Suffering Christian (cf. 3:22 with 4:1)
- B. Christ's life summed up in four stages and three offices:
  - 1. Cradle—Sent as Prophet
  - 2. Cross—Sacrificed as Priest
  - 3. Crown—Rules as King
  - 4. Clouds (2<sup>nd</sup> Coming)—Judges as King
- C. John 6:53–56—Eating and Drinking of Christ is Abiding in Him
- D. In the "not yet" of the Christian Life, the Cross Has Prominence
- E. John 1:29—Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the Sin of the World
- F. Christians have a theology of the Cross, not a theology of Glory

#### 3. The Intentional Resolution of the Christian Life

- A. Arming yourself means you are intentional with this weapon
  - 1. Jesus set his face like a flint toward Jerusalem (Lk. 9:51-53):
  - 2. Prepared to die and prepared to suffer are two different things
  - 3. Intentionality Begins today
- B. Arming Yourself means you are familiar with and proficient in the use of this weapon
  - 1. A good soldier exercises familiarity with and proficiency in his weapon
  - 2. Practice Greater intentionality in your spiritual life than you do in your temporal life
- C. Arming yourself means you use the example of Christ

## **Conclusion:**

- A. Christ's Suffering is a pattern and a guarantee for Christians
- B. The Suffering of the unconverted will give way to ultimate suffering if they do not repent and believe.
