II. Zechariah's Hymn of Praise 67-79

- A. God's Faithfulness to the Davidic Covenant 68-71
 - 1. The Davidic Covenant in simplest terms was the promise made by God to David that his throne would be an everlasting one. **2 Samuel 7:8-16**

Isaiah 9:6-7 -- For unto us a Child is born, Unto us a Son is given; And the government will be upon His shoulder. And His name will be called Wonderful, Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Of the increase of *His* government and peace *There will be* no end, Upon the throne of David and over His kingdom, To order it and establish it with judgment and justice From that time forward, even forever. The zeal of the LORD of hosts will perform this.

2. The horn of salvation

Psalm 132:11-18 -- The LORD has sworn *in* truth to David; He will not turn from it: I will set upon your throne the fruit of your body.

¹² If your sons will keep My covenant And My testimony which I shall teach them, Their sons also shall sit upon your throne forevermore."

¹³ For the LORD has chosen Zion; He has desired *it* for His dwelling place:

¹⁵ I will abundantly bless her provision; I will satisfy her poor with bread.

¹⁷ There I will make **the horn of David** grow I will prepare a lamp for My Anointed.

B. God's Faithfulness to the Abrahamic Covenant 72-75

There are 4 infinitives that tie this thought together.

- 1) To perform mercy (v. 72a)
- 2) To remember as in remembering His covenant (v. 72b)
- 3) To grant which is to give or bestow to us (v. 74a)
- 4) Might serve is also an infinitive to serve that's the reason (v. 74b)

Genesis 12:1-3

I will bless them that bless you. I will curse them that curse you.

Genesis 22:15-18

In verse 16 – God says, "By myself I have sworn". The commentary on this in Hebrews 6:13-18 tells us that God swore by Himself because there was nothing greater He could swear by.
