

This diagram represents the *membership* of the various biblical covenants.

- 1. The federal headship of Adam and Christ in the Covenant of Works and Covenant of Grace are mutually exclusive. They do not overlap in any way.
- 2. The New Covenant is the Covenant of Grace, and its membership is coextensive with the Covenant of Redemption.
- Everyone is a part of the Noahic Covenant, living in a world of common grace and preservation.
- 4. The membership of the
 Abrahamic Covenant is
 coextensive with the Mosaic Covenant, but
 simultaneously divided (not necessarily equally)
 between the Covenant of Works and the Covenant of
 Grace.
- The Davidic Covenant represents a subset of the Abrahamic people under the Mosaic law, likewise belonging either to the Covenant of Works or the Covenant of Grace.



6. While we are citizens of only one of two cities (per Augustine) such that the Covenant of Works and Covenant of Grace are mutually exclusive, we are yet citizens of two kingdoms, the common kingdom via the Noahic Covenant and the kingdom of Christ via the New Covenant
