- A New Covenant would come. Deuteronomy 10:16, 30:6;

Obedience in the New Covenant

How It Brought Paul Salvation:

- In Spiritual Growth: Philippians 1:20, 3:8-11; Colossians 1:24.
- In Death: Philippians 1:19-26, 2:17; 2 Timothy 4:6-8.

The Humble Servants of Jesus Christ...

Put others before self

- First, we must remind ourselves that Jesus Christ is clearly God. See John 1:1-4; Colossians 1:15; Hebrews 1:1-3; and Philippians 1:6, "he was in the form of God."
- "Let your attitude to life be that of Christ Jesus himself. For he, who had always been God by nature, did not cling to his privileges as God's equal, but stripped himself of every advantage by consenting to be a slave by nature and being born a man. And, plainly seen as a human being, he humbled himself by living a life of utter obedience, to the point of

- death, and the death he died was the death of a common criminal." -- J.B. Phillips', The New Testament in Modern English, Philippians 2:5-8.
- Some Selfish attitudes: Satan, Isaiah 14:12-15 and Ezekiel 28:11-19. Adam, Genesis 3:1-7. Mankind, Genesis 11:4.

Today's Big Idea: The Upward Call is a call to move toward Christ together, being of one mind united in His body the Church.

Emphasis, Unity: Indicators that Paul was very concerned with the unity of this church:

- Specific passages on the issue: Philippians 2:1-4, 4:2-7.
- The recurring use of the idea of a unified mind or life. Philippians 1:27, 2:2, 4:2 (agree).
- The use of the prefix sun meaning "with" throughout the letter. (see bonus section below) Paul uses the idea to indicate togetherness between the church at Philippi with himself; all believers with one another; and all believers with Christ.

Paul's emphasis on unity is seen in Philippians 4:2-7 in five words or phrases: Agree, companion, help, labored side by side, fellow workers.

This is a people doing the will of God, and there can be no greater peace between God and man.

Think about These Things, Philippians 4:8-9

Introduction

- Today's verses: Philippians 4:8-9.
- Big Idea: Rejoicing, prayer, and right thinking are the keys to taking on the mind of Christ, having the peace of God instead of anxiety, and maintaining unity in the gospel work.
- How these three things relate:
 - Rejoicing comes from the heart.
 - Thinking takes place in the mind.
 - Prayer connects heart and mind to God.
- Bookends to the command to "think about these things":
 - Verse 7: "The peace of God...will heard your hearts and vour minds..."

"Christian contentment is that sweet, inward, quiet, gracious frame of spirit, which freely submits to and delights in God's wise and fatherly disposal in every condition." — Jeremiah Burroughs

- It is a "Frame of Spirit": This is an inward matter of the soul that underlies all other aspects of personality, temperament, and affections.
- It "freely submits": Rather than rejecting circumstances, the contented one puts himself under the circumstances.
- It "delights in" the circumstances: Precisely because it is in these circumstances that God stands ready to accomplish His will in you.

"The righteous man can never be made so poor, to have his house so rifled and spoiled, but there will remain much treasure within. The presence of God and the blessing of God are upon him, and therein is much treasure." — Jeremiah Burroughs.



 - Exclusiveness as expressed by Jesus: Matthew 11:27; John 3:18, 6:53, 10:7-9; 14:6, 17:3, 18:37. In John 17:3 the definition of eternal life is knowledge of Jesus and the Father.
 - See also: John 4; Matthew 19:16-29.
- And the Apostles continued to teach the exclusiveness of Christ.
 - See 1 John 5:12; 1 Timothy 2:5; Galatians 1:6-9; Revelation 3:5, 13:8, 17:8, 20:11-15, 21:27.

The Relevance of this Teaching Today

- We live in a pluralistic society.
- Our desire for religion shows our need for God.
- Our desire for a religion other than Jesus Christ shows our rebellion.
- Deny exclusivity and we deny Jesus
- All religions cannot lead to God
- Make a decision about Jesus Christ

The Giving

- The urge to give is a reminder of our situation.
 - That there is scarcity reminds us that we live in a fallen world, cursed by sin.
 - o That we desire to do something about it reminds us that the law of God is written on our hearts.
 - o That we struggle whenever we try to do something about it reminds us that each of us is corrupted by sin.

The sharing was:

- A free sharing of personal property with others in need.
- Voluntary, not compelled by a governing authority.
- Not an abolition of private property.
- Generous.
- Limited to the context of the believers.

This sharing fulfilled:

• The biblical ideal of a people without poor among them. Deuteronomy 15:4-11.

- Jesus' command to love one another. John 13:34-35.
- Jesus' promise to provide for the needs of His people. Matthew 6:25-34; Mark 10:29-30.
- Jesus' redefinition of the family as the people of God. Matthew 12:46-50.

But what about tithing? (Giving our first 10%)

- Tithing precedes the law. Genesis 14:20.
- The New Testament never tells us to stop tithing as it does with circumcision. Luke 11:42.
- Tithing is still an exercise of faith. Malachi 3:6-12.
- Tithing should be a starting point for a Christian.
- Christians should give generously and cheerfully toward the needs of others and the work of the ministry. 2 Corinthians 9.

The Taking

- Their crime seemed to be ...

 - An act of insincere worship. See Matthew 6:1-24.

The Advancing Gospel, Acts 8:1-25

Background on Samaritans: The Northern Kingdom of Israel was defeated by Assyria in 722 B.C. They scattered many of the Israelites there and settled foreigners in the land in their place. See 2 Kings 17:24-41 for a description of the origin of "Samaritans." Samaritans were despised by "true" Israelites in the days of Jesus and the Apostles. See also Acts 8:4-25, 9:31, 15:3; John 4; 2 Kings 23:19; 2 Chronicles 30:10-11; Jeremiah 31:5; Ezra 4:1-6; Luke 9:51-56, 10:30-37, 17:11-19; Matthew 10:5-6.

The Advance

- This is a fulfillment of Acts 1:8. Just as Jesus predicted.
- See also Acts 1:8, 6:5; Matthew 28:18-20; Acts 28:30-31.

The Resistance

- Signs that Simon did not believe:

The Reinforcements

- Acts 8:12-17, the Samaritans heard, were baptized, received the Holy Spirit later by the laying on of hands.
- Acts 2:38, Peter preached, told the crowd to repent, be baptized, and they will receive the Spirit. Here, Peter is only describing what to do and what will happen. He is not making an absolute chronology.
- Acts 10:44-48, the Gentiles heard Peter's preaching, received the Holy Spirit, and then were baptized.
- Here in Acts 8, God withheld the Holy Spirit from the Samaritans until it could come through the Apostles themselves from Jerusalem. This made the source of the true gospel clear, and unified the church, fulfilling Jeremiah 50:4-5.
- Salvation comes by hearing the Gospel, Romans 10:8-15, the drawing of God, John 6:44, 65, and the believing of the hearer, Mark 1:15, 16:16; John 1:12, 3:16-18, 11:25-27, 20:30-31. The Spirit is at work all through this process, John 3:3-8, 6:63; and all who believe receive the Spirit, Romans 8:9, John 14:17. Then the true believer obeys by getting baptized, Matthew 28:19, Acts 2:38.

Why the Virgin Birth? Luke 1:26-38

Who:

4:15; Isaiah 9:1-2.

- Gabriel: See Daniel 8:16, 9:21; Luke 1:19, 1:26.
- Mary: A virgin, betrothed to a man of the house of David. See Genesis 3:15. Isaiah 7:14.
- Joseph: A man of the house of David. See 2 Samuel 7:1-17, Psalm 110:1-4.
- Holy Spirit: The agent of conception.
- Jesus Christ: The child, in this passage called Jesus (Jehovah is salvation), King in the line of David (implied), Son of the Most High, holy, the Son of God. See Genesis 3:14, 12:1-3, 49:10.

What: "You will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus." Luke 1:31.

When: In the sixth month of Elizabeth's pregnancy, Luke 1:26, 36. Where: A city of Galilee named Nazareth, Luke 1:26; Matthew 2:23, WHow: "The Holy Spirit will come upon you and the power of the Most High will overshadow you," Luke 1:35, Zechariah 4:6-7, Matthew 1:12, Luke 3:27.

Why Was a Virgin Birth Necessary?

- Jesus could not have a human father, or else he would inherit the guilt and condemnation of the sin of Adam, like we all have. He would thus not have been a perfect sacrifice. (See Hebrews 4:15,7:26, 9:28; 1 Pet. 2:22; 1 John 3:5.) Jesus was in essence a "new Adam," and our invitation is to join His line through faith.
- We have the guilt and condemnation of Adam imputed to us, Romans 5:12-21:
 - o "Sin came into the world through one man, and death through sin, and so death spread to all men because all sinned...many died through one man's trespass...And the free gift is not like the result of that one man's sin...because of one man's trespass, death reigned through that one man...one trespass led to condemnation for all men...by the one man's disobedience the many were made sinners." [Romans 5:12-21 selected, emphasis added]
 - So we inherit the sin and guilt of Adam, because Adam was our federal representative in the creation covenant. The same kind of argument is used in Hebrews 7:9-10 to indicate that in Abraham, the future Israelite priests effectively tithed to Melchizedek, showing his priesthood to be superior to their own.
- The promise of the Gospel is that we can be adopted into this new line by faith in Jesus Christ, so we may inherit that which belongs to the only Son of God rather than that which belongs to Adam. See John 1:12-13.
- The virgin birth therefore was predicted form the beginning. See Genesis 3:15, and understand the Hebrew word for "offspring" means more fundamentally "seed" which refers to the man's contribution in human reproduction.
