A FEW WORDS ABOUT OUR WORSHIP

Standing and raising hands

Because we are whole people with bodies as well as souls, we use our bodies in worship, as the Bible commands. We raise our hands to look to God for help and bless God (Ps. 28:2, 63:3), and we stand to hear the Word out of reverence for God (Neh. 8:5).

The Lord's Supper

The Sacrament of communion is a rite of fellowship between Christ and His people. We invite all who have been initiated into the family of God by baptism, and admitted to table fellowship by the leadership of this or some other church, to join in the communion service by faith. If you are unbaptized, or not a church member, please speak with the pastor or elders before the service if you would like to come to join in the Holy Supper.

Children

You will notice many children in our service today. Jesus welcomed little children to Himself, and so we welcome them in our worship service! Therefore, we have drawn upon ourselves, by your just sentence, condemnation and death.

But, O Lord, with heartfelt sorrow we repent and deplore our offences! We condemn ourselves and our evil ways, with true penitence, beseeching that your grace may relieve our distress. Be pleased then to have compassion upon us, O most gracious God, Father of all mercies, for the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, our Lord.

And, in removing our guilt and our pollution, grant us the daily increase of the grace of your Holy Spirit; that, acknowledging from our inmost hearts our own unrighteousness, we may be touched with sorrow that shall work true repentance; and that your Spirit, mortifying all sin within us, may produce the fruits of holiness and righteousness well-pleasing in your sight;

*Confession of Faith

Formulario (1559)

What it is to be a Christian.

Since we have to declare ourselves Christians making an open and public profession (1 Peter 3:15), we must first of all recognize that to be a Christian (that is, in general, to be of the true religion of Jesus Christ, to be His true faithful ones, to be true and living members of his body – namely of His holy church – to be by faith saved in Him and made God's children, justified and sanctified and partakers of all the good things of Christ and to be heirs with Him of eternal life) is not a natural thing for anyone, for we are all born in an entirely contrary state, but it is a supernatural grace and gift of God, who regenerated us and has begotten us again spiritually by faith.


