 - 1. A Unity that Reflects the Divine Unity of the Father and the Son
 - 2. A Unity that Induces the World to Believe
 - a. That Jesus was Sent by the Father
 - b. That Believers are Loved by God
 - 3. Nature of this Unity: not merely outward, ecumenical, or institutional, but spiritual; a unity of love, mind, effort, purpose; a unity in the truth; must be cultivated and perfected; must be expressed in tangible ways; is achieved through commitment to the mission Jesus' followers have been charged with; pursued in conscious dependence on God
 - B. For His People's Glorification (vs. 24-26)
 - 1. See His glory = be glorified with Him in His presence (1 John 3:2)
 - 2. Jesus promises to continue His revelation (through the HS) so that the love of the Father for the Son will be in them; so that Christ Himself will be with them

Practical Lessons

- 1) Several Lessons from the Scope of Jesus' Prayers: the extent of Christ's atonement; Christ's intercession for His people; His people's intercession for others
- 2) Our spiritual unity with, and love for, other believers in Christ ought to be evident to the world.
- 3) Think much about the good things God intends for His people.
