The Physiologic “Spiral of Intimate Speech”

Self-disclosure (from the wooer) + *Stretch* —> Dopamine neurons in the listener (the “wooded”) primed

Self-disclosure (from the wooed) + *Stretch* —> Dopamine which had been accumulating as a result of the self-disclosure and “stretch” is released

Angus Fletcher in *Wonderworks*:

“...keep on exchanging wonder-enriched self-disclosures with our wooer, creating a reciprocal cycle of dopamine prime and release that makes us feel increasingly happy together and encourages us to disclose more personal details to each other until we’ve built an intimate emotional bond”

Dead to Sin, Alive to God

1 What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound?

2 By no means! How can we who died to sin still live in it?

3 Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death?

4 We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life.

5 For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his.

6 We know that our old self was crucified with him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin.
