**The Everlasting Ruler out of Little Bethlehem**

**I. The Unlikely Place**

- A. Micah emphasizes the unlikelihood that the everlasting Ruler would be born in Bethlehem.

- B. What is God's purpose in this? God chose this way to display His glory and grace (I Corinthians 1:27-31; Titus 2:11).

**II. The Everlasting Ruler**

- A. He is the Ruler in whom God has placed all authority and through Whom God glorifies Himself.

- B. What did this Ruler come to do? The text tells us that He came to do the will of God redeeming us with His blood and ruling over His church by His power and grace.

**III. The Amazing Blessings**

- A. He gives the highest blessing of peace with Him (Micah 5:5).
