The Olivet Discourse 5: The Imminent Second Coming Matthew 24:32-44

I. Introduction: Contrasts between the first and second Advents of Christ

The doctrine of the Second Coming in the Creeds and in Scripture point to a literal, physical, and near-future return of Jesus Christ.

II. Jesus illustrates imminence from the fig tree (vss. 32-35)

"Soon" does not mean today or this month or year, but it does mean "any time."

vs. 34 - Different ideas about the words "this generation"

Really bad ideas: Preterism, Jesus was wrong, "one divine event"

Not so good ideas: generation means race, links to Israel in 1948 or 1967

Intriguing ideas: the fig tree refers to the destruction of Jerusalem, dual fulfillment Is too much being made of these words? Could it simply mean, "this generation?"

vs. 35 - The words of Jesus will never pass away
