Prelude

Call to Worship

Notice how, at the end of these verses, justice and "steadfast love" (mercy) are juxtaposed as summarizing the character of the Lord. We will see these again in the summary of God's expressed will for the character of His people in today's sermon passage.

Psalm 33:1–5 ESV

- ¹ Shout for joy in the LORD, O you righteous!
Praise befits the upright.
- ² Give thanks to the LORD with the lyre;
make melody to him with the harp of ten strings!
- ³ Sing to him a new song;
play skillfully on the strings, with loud shouts.
- ⁴ For the word of the LORD is upright,
and all his work is done in faithfulness.
- ⁵ He loves righteousness and justice;
the earth is full of the steadfast love of the LORD.

WE ACKNOWLEDGE OUR SIN

* Reading from the Law

Central to our sermon passage today is God's Covenant with His people, which disposes them to blessing or cursing depending on their response to His promises and their obligations under that Covenant. Here God passionately appeals to His people through Moses: do those things which result in His blessing, which is always the desire of the Covenant Lord, who is both righteous and loving, for His people. This appeal is the gist of the application of today's sermon.

Deuteronomy 30:15–20 ^{ESV}

"See, I have set before you today life and good, death and evil. ¹⁶ If you obey the commandments of the LORD your God that I command you today, by loving the LORD your God, by walking in his ways, and by keeping his commandments and his statutes and his rules, then you shall live and multiply, and the LORD your God will bless you in the land that you are entering to take possession of it. ¹⁷ But if your heart turns away, and you will not hear, but are drawn away to worship other gods and serve them, ¹⁸ I declare to you today, that you shall surely perish. You shall not live long in the land that you are going over the Jordan to enter and possess. ¹⁹ I call heaven and earth to witness against you today, that I have set before you life and death, blessing and curse. Therefore choose life, that you and your offspring may live, ²⁰ loving the LORD your God, obeying his voice and holding fast to him, for he is your life and length of days, that you may dwell in the land that the LORD swore to your fathers, to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob, to give them."

Silent Confession of Sin

Corporate Confession of Sin

The confession in this hymn is found in the last part of verse 4 and the prayer of verse 5, in which we acknowledge our sin and weakness before God, and pray that He might transform us by His grace, saving us not only from sin's guilt, but also ultimately from its very presence.

WE REJOICE IN THE ASSURANCE OF FORGIVENESS

Assurance of Pardoning Grace

*The proclamation of the angel to the shepherds never gets old: "...for unto **you** is born this day...a **Savior. Remember**, in the biblical sense, this truth today, and rejoice in your **soul**, for this is life eternal!*

Luke 2:10, 11 ^{ESV}

And the angel said to them, "Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. ¹¹ For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord."

Leader: This is the gospel.

Congregation: Hallelujah!

Distribution of Elements

Because we believe that wine was used in the Last Supper and is thus more in accord with the fullness of symbolism intended by God in the Lord's Supper, we offer wine and encourage those who take part in Communion to take this. For those with conscientious convictions against the use of wine, however, we offer the option of grape juice, which is contained in the inner circle of the communion trays. The cups containing wine are in the outer circles of the trays.

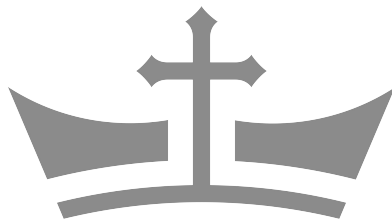
