Matthew 1:18-24

THE CHRISTMAS MESSAGE TO JOSEPH

- The historical setting.
 - A. The history of Joseph and Mary's engagement is the first historical evidence that Jesus is Immanuel.
 - 1. "Espoused" or "betrothed" is a legal promise and commitment to marry more than our engagement.
 - 2. Only after this period of time, which ended with the ceremony, could the man live with his wife in sexual union.
 - B. A very surprised Joseph learned that Mary "was found with child."
 - 1. He "thought on these things" (20), i.e., turned them over in his mind, struggling under the burden of his thoughts.
 - 2. Joseph is identified as a "just man" (19) meaning that he was regenerated and godly.
- II. While contemplating what to do, the angel appeared to him in a dream (20b).
 - A. As was the norm for God-sent angels, he comes out of divine mercy.
 - 1. He began with a command (reflecting God's will for His own): "Fear not."
 - 2. And "Fear not to take unto thee Mary thy wife."
 - 3. The angel gave a reason: "that which is conceived in her is of the Holy Ghost."
 - B. In this way Jesus can be the Savior and Immanuel.
 - 1. God conceived this child so he can be God.
 - 2. This is the truth which must be believed to be saved unto eternal life (John 3:16-18).
 - C. The wonder of grace grows: He is "Jesus" Jehovah salvation (21).
 - 1. Jehovah salvation is to "save His people from their sins."
 - 2. That He saves from their sins explains the manger and the cross.
 - 3. The great joy of Christmas is exactly that He came precisely to deal with the reality of our sin.
- III. The responding faith: Joseph believed and obeyed (24).
 - A. God graciously worked in Joseph what He works in us: the ability to believe the impossible.
 - B. God performs this wonder in our hearts this morning too when we see the Baby in the manger and we worship Him.
