Explain the concept of grace incarnate.

Incarnate: to give bodily form to that which has no form.
God, after He spoke long ago to the fathers in the prophets in many portions and in many ways in these last days has spoken to us in His Son. Hebrews 1:1–2a 3

Grace incarnates delivers.
