Ahaziah's Attitude

2 Kings 1:1-18; Heb 12:28-29

Other times the LORD sent fire from heaven: 1 King 18:38; Lev 9:24; 1 Chr 21:26; 2 Chr 7:1; Gen 19:24; Num 11:1; Lev 10:2; Num 16:35.

- **I. IS THERE NO GOD IN ISRAEL?** (vs. 3, 6, 16)
 - **A.** The evidence of worship is where you turn in crisis. (2 Chr 16:12)
 - 1. When we are sick, we should seek the LORD.
 - 2. The world is <u>watching</u> what we will turn to in our time of need.
 - **B.** The LORD is zealous to defend His reputation. (Is 42:8)
 - 1. Among <u>His people</u>
 - **2. Before the Nations** (Jer 22:8-9)
- **II. BE CAREFUL HOW YOU SPEAK TO A MAN OF GOD.** (vs. 9-15)
 - **A.** The Authority of a Prophet (Mat 5:11-12; Jn 15:18-20)—Servant of the LORD, Man of God
 - **B.** The Command of a King (9, 11)
 - **1. Show of Force**—50 soldiers to get one prophet
 - 2. Contempt for the **Prophetic Office**—dislike, disrespect
 - **3. No <u>Fear of God</u>**—as if not real or His authority is inferior
 - C. <u>The Vindication of God's Prophet</u> (9-12)—"*If I am a man of God*, let fire come down from heaven and consume you!"
 - **1. Inviting God to decide the matter**—judicial miracle
 - a. Demonstrates God's relevance and holiness
 - b. Defends the authority of God's prophet
 - 2. Reprimanding the insolent manner
- **III.** THE JOHN THE BAPTIST CONNECTION (Mal 4:5-6; Mk 1:4-6; Mat 11:14 & 17:10-13; Lk 1:17)

- **A.** <u>The Clothing of a Prophet</u> (v. 8; Mk 1:6; Mt 11:7-9)— garment of hair and leather belt
 - **1.** <u>Austere</u> in the face of luxury (Mt 11:8)—challenge to the world's values
 - **2. Illustrates the theme of** repentance (Is 22:12; Mt 5:3-4)
- **B.** The Character of a Prophet (Mt 11:7)
 - 1. Lived in the Desert
 - Separated from the world, its values and distractions
 - Illustrated the true spiritual condition of the nation
 - **2. Boldly Confronted Sin**—they refused to be intimidated.
- **C.** The Ministry of a Prophet (Mt 11:11)—OT prepares for NT
 - 1. Warning of <u>Judgment</u>
 - 2. Calling to Repentance

IV. <u>Judgment and Mercy</u>

- A. Elijah Warns.
 - **1. Death**—we will all die someday.
 - **2. Fire** (Lk 3:9, 17; Heb 10:27)—represents the complete destruction of the wicked (Hell)
- **B. Jesus Rescues**. (Lk 9:54-55)
 - **1. Jesus brings us the mercy of God.**—not condemn but save
 - 2. Christians are called to be messengers of *grace*.
 - 3. <u>Christians</u> need the mercy of God just as much as any other sinner does.
- **C. Salvation requires** <u>repentance</u>. (Mt 3:2; Mk 6:12; Act 2:38; 3:19; 17:30)
 - **1. Humility seeks and receives** mercy. (Jas 4:6, 10; Joel 2:32/Acts 2:21/ Rom 10:13).
 - **2. Defiance invites** <u>destruction</u>**.** (Mal 4:1; Ps 2:1-6)
