In Matthew 7:15-20 we examined the danger of being deceived by a false teacher. In verses 21-23 we saw the danger of being self-deceived, trusting our profession or activities for a measure of assurance. And now in verses 24-27 we see the true spiritual danger of desiring God's blessing, but not desiring God.

 - A. They Hear
 - 1. To Listen – a willingness to hear
 - 2. To Accept what is said as authoritative
 - B. The Wise Man Does – to produce; obedience to what is heard
 - C. The Foolish Man Does Not Do – decides to disregard, disobey what is heard
- II. The Trials
 - A. Come on Both the Wise and Foolish
 - B. Response to Trials Proves the Foundation – James 1:2-3; 1 Peter 1:6-7; 4:12-13
- III. The Foundation
 - A. The Wise Man Dug Down to Find Rock – Luke 6:46-49
 - B. The Foolish Man Built on the Surface
 - 1. In a hurry, impatient
 - 2. Disregards instruction – Prov. 1:7, 32; 10:21; 12:1, 15; 14:16; 15:5, 32; 18:2; 19:27

46 "But why do you call Me 'Lord, Lord,' and not do the things which I say? 47 Whoever comes to Me, and hears My sayings and does them, I will show you whom he is like: 48 He is like a man building a house, who dug deep and laid the foundation on the rock. And when the flood arose, the stream beat vehemently against that house, and could not shake it, for it was founded on the rock. 49 But he who heard and did nothing is like a man who built a house on the earth without a foundation, against which the stream beat vehemently; and immediately it fell. And the ruin of that house was great."

32 For the turning away of the simple will slay them, And the complacency of fools will destroy them;
